PREFACE

A few words about the research are needed.

Frist, it is important that I try to support the data with documents or media that support the data of each individual. This helps to validate and provide confirmation of the genealogy history recorded about a person and their families. In some cases I have seen many forms of data, but I only attached those that provide proof to help support my recordings. If I attached all I could find would provide too much for my computer files and overload the presentation.

In United States history are numerous varieties of record types that have been preserved. Each of these records provide the trail of the people and their documented history. There are many sources that provide information of this documented history. In this book are footnotes of the source documents or places this research has been recorded. There are so many types of sources to mention here, but this book provides some of that information as recorded in my Family Tree Maker (FTM) file.

Some of the data has been found or learned but have no supporting documentation. Why? Because to maintain limited electronic files; and that some of the information has been discovered on many sources. In some cases, it is real information known by people of these families.

Ireland is divided by two territories. Northern Ireland, and The Republic of Ireland (the Irish Free State). Northern Ireland is under the control of British rule. The Republic of Ireland is its own sovereignty nation. The name "Éire" is the nickname or name used for Ireland.

First, one has to understand the land divisions of countries. This helps understanding to find people and where they lived.

One important note about individual and family names. Each surname coupled with given names you will find many of the same name or combination of names. Therefore, other items such as parents, birth, death, marriage, territory, and possible other items are required to ensure one has identified the current person and family.

Enjoy reading, but there is so much to learn. This document will provide a base for anyone wishing to do genealogy research or just adding to this family information.

RESEARCH NOTES

Doing genealogy research is a long term and time-consuming task. If one is doing it for real, they will collect a great amount of data about life of people, the territory they lived, and learn about the uniting of families. For this researcher, there is much learned that is way above what is taught about history in school classes. Research can include working with on-line resources in today's Internet and can include travel to obtain information and documentation from Federal, State, County, City, or towns from records they kept. Cemetery records are a great source found on-line via the Internet.

There are many avenues why folks do genealogy research. For this researcher, I am not writing a book, I am trying to learn of past family and a small bit about them. I am not recording every detail that is possible. If I did, I would not be able to share what I have discovered in this book and I would still be on the road to discovery.

What is in this book is free to all to read, print, or share as they desire. This information is public and can be found by others; therefore, I am not doing this for any monies or profit, just for the pleasure of doing this research and a great retirement hobby for me.

This research has been ongoing between 2000 to 2021 to compile and record in this book. There are many resources, these are just some of them.

- 5. Find-a-Grave: [https://www.findagrave.com/]. In the attached files you may see the term "Memorial ID" with a number sequence. By going to the Find a Grave web site and entering this Memorial ID, that will take you to the grave information that has been recorded by folks who go to cemeteries and document the graves. In some cases, you will see the grave maker and other information folks have recorded for that person. In some cases, there are links to parents, siblings, and children along with spouses that all have a Memorial ID recorded.

NOTES:

- 1) ANCESTOR: Also known as a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.
- 2) DESCENDANT: Are descending after a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.
 - Meaning of "direct descendant" as opposed to "indirect descendant"
 - 1. A direct descendant is someone who can trace their lineage by "child" relationships all the way back to the desired ancestor.

2. A non-direct descendant has to go through a "cousin" or "by marriage" or some other non-child relationship in order to find the desired ancestor.

Definition of genealogy.

- 1. An account of the descent of a person, family, or group from an ancestor or from older forms.
- 2. Regular descent of a person, family, or group of organisms from a progenitor or older form: pedigree. The study of family ancestral lines.

Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of June 02, 2022.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children.

Any files/Media collected is attached to a person or family is pictured with each family.

The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. Each spouse and their children is a "Nuclear Family".

For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family.

Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Family of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Charles Fuhs are presented in a form of an enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose ancestors are listed in the later chapters.

The chapter titled "<HeadlineFamilies>" provides details (as known as of this publication date) for the ancestors of Charles Fuhs.

There is a chapter for each generation.


Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 90 individuals, of whom 45 are male and 45 are female. Of the 41 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 68.5 years. Of these, 22 males averaged 62.9 years, and 19 females averaged 74.9 years. The longest living male was Johann Jacob Augustin (1791–1883), who died aged 92. The longest living female was Alice Marie Becklund (1904–1997), who died aged 93.

He was baptized in Hessler, Gelsenkirchen, Germany (Luthern Church), in 1901. Charles John immigrated in 1902. He emigrated from Ship Kensington (Red Star Lines) POD Southampton, Antwerp, Belgium -- POA New York (Ellis Island), on February 03, 1902.^[5]

Charles John was naturalized in Plentywood, Sheridan Co., Montana, in July 1916.^[6] He was naturalized in Plentywood, Sheridan Co., Montana, on July 21, 1916.^[6]

He worked as "Certificate of Competency of Coal Mine": issued in caseyville, St. Clair, Illinois on December 17, 1918. [7] Charles John was employed on December 17, 1918, in "Certificate of Competency of Coal Mine" issued in Caseyville, St. Clair Co., Illinois. [8] Charles John worked as a Based on 1920 Census: Farm Hand in General Farming in 1920. He was employed between 1940 and 1960 in Heavy Equipment Operator. He served in the military on November 27, 1942.^[2] Charles John worked as a Georgetown Water Company between 1960 and 1966. He was employed between 1960 and 1966 in Georgetown Water Company.

Charles John died in Garden Valley, El Dorado, California, USA, on December 28, 1982, at the age of 81.^[2] He was buried in Georgetown, El Dorado, Ca., US (Georgetown Pioneer Cemetry), on December 30, 1982.

Person Notes: Charles is known as 'Charlie' by is family and friends.

His parents brought him to America when he was about seven months old arriving with his mother and older brother on 3 February 1902. His father having arrived in September 1901. Leaving family and a homeland, his parents sought to find new horizons and a new place for home. However, based on the birth place of the children, the family moved around a lot. It is said Charlie's father was always looking for work. Ohio, Illinois, Wisconsin, North Dakota, Montana and California are the most notable states the family has lived.

In the 1920's, Charles was working in a foundry that an accident caused him to lose his right eye. However, that did not deter his ability. He did many jobs without anyone realizing he has a single

eve. He wore a glass eye that helped the illusion and made his face appear normal in every way. Charles also worked as a cow hand in Montana for a number of years. Among his greatest assets with one eye was his ability to shot a gun very accurately. later part of 1942, Charlie was inducted into the Army, but soon after his induction, a law was passed that no one over age of 35 was to serve in the Army. Soon after that, about March/April 1943, he was released from the Army. During his time in the Army, his one eye soon became known as the best Sharp shooter in his outfit. Because he was such a good shot, the shooting range became a boring experience, so he would demonstrate shooting talents by performing trick shots for the troops. He was assigned to Battery #1-306-CA, in Hawthorne, California after basic training at Fort Ord in Monterey, California. As the family moved, so did Charles. Three of the brothers came to California where new careers were found and many started there married lives in California. Other siblings remained in Illinois as there home.

In the early 1940's, he came to California to stay permanently and soon found love with Mary Ruth. However, after their marriage, he was inducted into the Army for a brief time. After his discharge, Charles joined his wife and become a heavy equipment operator working with his brother Albert. Among his first tasks, he was involved with the first rough of land preparation for the Pebble Beach golf course.

Charles at some point in his life was also an extra working in early silent films. He was involved with such actors as Gabby Hayes and other cowboy film actors. During these films he was working as a ranch hand and was very good at horsemanship. Some thing he learned working as a "cowboy" or ranch had in Montana.

During their life time, Charles and Mary Ruth lived in the Santa Clara Valley, that included Hollister, San Benito, Ca. & Davenport, Santa Cruz County, Ca. About 1946 they moved to El Dorado County just east of Sacramento, California. There they lived for a short time in Greenwood, El Dorado, California and in1947 moved to their last home in Garden Valley, El Dorado, California.

In Garden Valley, Charles was operating heavy equipment in logging; and in 1960 he entered his last job for the Georgetown, El Dorado, Ca. water company. In 1966 he retired and enjoyed the life of leisure.

Charlie's greatest past time is when he could be found in his boat with a fishing line working the water for bass and cat fish. Most of his time was spent in a small lake only about 1/2 mile from the

Garden Valley home. However, he enjoyed various lakes and water sources around the El Dorado County hills and took pride in his ability to bring home his limit of fish. One of his greatest pets was his dog Boots. A small brown dog of about 20 pounds. Boots was most skillful at running raccoons up a tree. The "Charlie" would come along with his shot gun and bring the raccoon to the ground and then properly disposing of it's lifeless body. Charlie, as most people new him, always ensured he had his vehicles in running shape and took pride in his automobiles.

The home they moved into in Garden Valley was a small building barely big enough for 1 person let along a family of four. After several years in that building, a prefabricated home was purchased and placed on the property that provided a 3 bedroom home for the family that provided a suitable home for them. After about 15 years, Charlie demolished the old building and built a garage on the property. Their quarter acre home was passed on to their children until it was sold in the 1980s. Charlie was a great guy who loved his fishing excursions working the lures for bass and catfish; and how he could tell the tales. He could also do his part to maintain cars and repair them. He was a handy guy learning many of his tricks during the days as a ranch hand. Charlie was a will known guy and was loved by all.

He enjoined the family life and remained close to his and his wife's family. Charlie's memory is a picture of a great man, husband, father and a great friend to many.

Based on information from family members, the following story of his life is presented.

Charles came to America in 1901 traveling with his mother and brother Paul on a four week journey to New York. they processed through Ellis Island, then boarded a train where they met their father and first lived in Dillonvale, Ohio. Here they lived until 1903 and moved to Illinois. Again in 1910, the family relocated to Minnesota, they onto South and North Dakota when finally the family set up home on 180 acre homestead in Montana.

Charles began working after 2nd grade while the family was living in Montana to help support the family. When the family moved back to Illinois in 1917, Charles worked in the coal mines as proof of his certificate as a coal miner obtained in 1918.

Charles remained in America when his parents moved to Germany. He is known to obtain his miners certificate in 1918 in Illinois.

However, in 1920 he is found per census report working as a farm hand in Illinois. In 1921 when the family moved to Germany, Charles remained in America. While working in a foundry, Charles had an accident and lost one eye. It is known that he Charles did go back to Montana where he worked on ranches and spent time training horses and working in Canada and Montana areas. He was known to be a pretty fair handler of horses. As a result, he did work with the Silent Movies.

Charles became one the principles hired to work with his horses in Silent Films and did play some roles in some of the films but it unknown what details tell us about his film career. Some of those films were filmed in the Niles Canyon area near Fremont, California. Charles was a traveling man and did make many trips (according to stories he told his children) between California and Illinois. However, in 1942 he married and settled in California.

In 1942 he spent a few months in the United States Army, but was discharged as rules changed that no man over the age of 38 was to be in the military. However, part of the provision was to prove you would have a job to go directly to and also would help support the war effort. Through his brother William, Charles did secure a job and was discharged from the Army. He was a one-eyed sharp shooter and used to demonstrate shooting skills for the Army personnel.

He became involved with operating heavy earth moving equipment joining his brother William. He worked on many projects from Monterey to Santa Cruz. William was working in the El Dorado area when his second child was born. So William and Charles traded jobs in 1947 and Charles and family moved to El Dorado County and making their home there for the remainder of their lives. Charles was working heavy equipment for many years then taking a job with a local water company until he retired.

Mary Ruth was born in Harvey, Clay Township, Marion, Ia., US, on Monday, August 01, 1910.[10, 11] She was the daughter of Roy Merrill Bridgham and Pauline Sarver. She was also known as **Ruth**.

Mary Ruth graduated in Chowchilla, Madera, Ca. US (Chowchilla High School), on June 19, 1928. She achieved a degree in Nursing (Never Graduated, O'Connor Hospital Classes), between 1930 and 1933.

Mary Ruth was employed between June 1961 and 1975 in Psychiatric Technician at DeWitt State Hospital -- Auburn, Placer, California. She graduated in DeWitt Sate Hospital; Pshchiatric Technician on June 22, 1961.

Mary Ruth worked as a Prac.Nurse. Mary Ruth reached 68 years of age and died in Garden Valley, El Dorado, California, USA, on February 04, 1979. Her cause of death was Aneurysm, descending thoracic aorta. Mary Ruth was buried in Georgetown, El Dorado, Ca., US (Georgetown Pioneer Cemetry), on February 08, 1979.

She was the oldest child of Roy & Pauline Bridgham. In 1912, her parents moved them to California. She grew up in Chowchilla, California on her fathers dairy farm. She graduated from Chowchilla High School on June 19, 1928. Soon there after, the family moved to Santa Clara in Santa Clara County, California. There she began studies at O'Connor Hospital in classes majoring in However, the death of her mother in 1932 was an unexpected event in the Bridgham family and she never finished her nursing education. The family having young children ranging from two to eighteen years old, Ruth left school to help with the family. Ruth and her sister Margaret begin working as short order cooks and working as domestic living at times in peoples homes. 1942 she meet Charles while working as a short order cook in Campbell, California and they soon become a couple of young Later that year they were married. After the marriage, lovers. Charles was inducted into the Army, but soon was discharged due

to a change in laws to the age of inductees.

Charles was working heavy equipment and found work that located the family in San Benito County and later after the children were born in Santa Cruz County. In 1946, the family located to Greenwood, California and again in 1947 moved to Garden Valley, California. This became their permanent home until there passing.

During this time, Charles found work with many folks running heavy equipment and the family soon built a home on the land and moved form an old barn like structure into a new 3 bedroom home. The barn stood on the property until about 1968 when Charles torn it down and constructed a garage. The home was a happy place that found Ruth involved in many task. In the community, she was a founding member of the Garden Valley Chapel, a non denominational church. She supported the church and was for a long time one of their organist. Ruth learned to play the piano (like her father) and also had talent that chimed the ivory of the Her father's piano was part of her furniture until church organ. she decided to purchase an two keyboard organ. Her father's piano was moved to the home of her sister Gertrude. The organ was one of her pastimes she enjoyed. Also, she was a very capable cook She made many of her favorite recipes and entered and chief. pies, cakes and other goodies to the local El Dorado and Tri-County (El Dorado, Placer, Nevada) fairs each year. She was rewarded with many blue, red and white ribbons on many occasions.

Among her special talents, she maintained a colorful yard of flowers and plants. She, along with help from Charles, planted a garden. However it was a heavy burden to manage with many of the hungry wild animals that loved to nibble on the growing plants. Her yard had many variety of plants that provided grand color and spectacular decorations on her dinner table and many family occasions.

Not only was she a musician, cook and gardener, she loved her special times with her crossword puzzles, crocheting, and many other small crafts that occupied her time. She would spend hours playing solitaire and its many varieties; however, many knew that she had a special talent. Also, she was a great seamstress. She made many clothes for her daughters and would help others with sewing projects. Although she was a natural left-handed person, she could write with almost equal ability with both hands.

After her children had entered high school, Ruth returned to a job accepting a position in 1961 with the DeWitt State Hospital in Auburn, Placer, Ca She entered as a nurse soon achieving the title

of Psychiatric Technician. Responsibilities where with special people who could not function normal society commonly referred to as mentally handicapped. She worked at this profession until her retirement in 1973.

Ruth enjoyed a great life and contributed much to her family and friends as a great advisor and just being a friend. 1945-1953: Davenport, Iowa 1643 West 15th John was an adventurer and had many friends about the neighborhood. He played with all those kids and was most time late in getting home. His dad would come looking for John and If John didn't sneak around his dad and get home, he would always get a whipping from his daddy. John was just having fun and never wanted to give up on his many activities. From the east end of the block to the west, the street had a natural fall and this is where he learned to ride his sister bicycle. One day, after many tries, John was able to control and steer the bike on two wheels, from then on, he was a bicycle rider. Many times sneaking the bicycle off where Mom and Dad did not know.

In the winter, snow would cover the ground and the houses on the street were at different levels to the street. This provided 3 levels of hills to enjoy the snow. 


Figure 4: Fuhs Charles J (4/11/2022 2:24:34 PM)





Figure 9: 1930 United States Federal Census Year: 1930; Census Place: Belleville, St. Clair, Illinois; Page: 4A; Enumeration District: 0016

Rumor: circa 1929-1933 Johann & Maria returned to Germany. To Gelsenkirchen, Germany. Johann didn't like the USA and hard

to find work there. In Germany they bought a "beer garden". This place was the location of their first meeting and was the work place for Maria at the time of their meeting. The German Marc (money) was becoming worthless. As a result, the German government was in the early stages of persecution of Jews. Jewish ancestry was the background of Maria and was in her best interest to leave the home land. The couple returned to the United States.

1940 Census Line 76 Page 13B Show John (Farm Hand), Maria, and son Charles (Laborer road Work) Address is route 4, box 770? located in San Jose, Santa Clara, Califonria, Based on information from family members, the following story of his life has been developed.

As some stories and some records found in US research state Johann's birth location is "Holland"; one story states his mother was traveling visiting relatives in Holland. The long trip on trains is reason that she began labor and gave birth to Johann while in Holland. Her visit to the "Holland" area was close to the boarder of Germany and Holland of today. Her family emigrated to that area in the late 1700s on their way out of the country but did not secure passage on a ship. They settled in the boarder area of Germany & Holland which was under French control for a few years in the early 1800s.

However, based on research and birth document found indicate that Johann was born in Gelsenkirchen area of Germany. Ffor this record, he is recorded as born in Gelsenkirchen, Germany. Johann was raised in this area and when old enough to work, he was required to go to work and turn over his wages to his parents.

Johann began work in the Coal Mines when he was 16 years old. At age 21 he had to serve two years in the Army. While in the Army he was stationed in Gelsenkirchen. This is where he met Maria Schmidt when she was working in a Beer Garden. When Johann's Army service ended, they were married.

While Maria's parents were opposed to this marriage, and the fact Maria was pregnant at the time of marriage, Johann & Maria were married in The Beer Garden with support from her employer. A large party was held in the Beer Garden and attended by both parents of Johann & Maria and their families. Living with Johann's parents, Johann & Maria soon decided to move to America after a visit from Johann's sister Maria who lived in America.

Johann entered America through Ellis Island in 1901 arriving with

his sister Anna. In February 1902, Maria and two eldest sons arrived and joined Johann who found work in a coal mine in Dillonville, Jefferson County, Ohio. Both entered America through Ellis Island then riding a train to Ohio.

They first lived in Dillonvale, Ohio while Johann had a job in a coal mine. However after a few years the work slowed and they moved to Fairview Heights, Illinois. Here life began to prosper until Johann had worked very hard in the coal mine and spent many long hours building a family home. He soon became stricken with rheumatism and the family had to move to Belleville where Johann began treatment by traveling between Belleville and St. Louis. Doctors suggested he move to a drier climate and through a friend, Johann left the family and moved to Minnesota. Soon Maria had to move from the home with the family due to lack of funds; Johann sent money for the family to come to Minnesota. Johann was working as a farm laborer but soon decided to follow the farm equipment to So. Dakota and then No. Dakota. But work became slim and the family soon moved to Montana in 1912 were Johann was obtained a Land Patent in 1917 for 320 acres. Working the land, cold winters, crops that did good one year but another spoiled due to a hail storm but the family was beginning to prosper again. While in So. Dakota, Johann applied and took his test for citizenship; In 1916, Johann received his naturalization papers while living in Montana that also naturalized Maria, Paul and Charles, all other children born in U.S. With the naturalization, Johann changed his given name to John.

Then World War I started and because the Fuhs family were German, their friends and neighbors began to turn against him. Threats to the family caused John to sell out and move the family back to Illinois. However, older son Paul stayed in Montana, joined the Army and eventually married in 1921. Johann & family moved back to a small community near Belleville, Illinois where John still had German friends. John went to work in the coal mines and soon purchased a home for his family. However, John and Maria longed to visit their family that they had not heard from since 1902; they decided to return to Germany in in late 1920. John & Maria took the 3 youngest children with them to Germany and the 4 older boys In Germany, they purchased an apartment remained in America. with a Tayern on the ground floor. But due to the poor times after the war and the value of German money was worthless, living there was very difficult. So they decided to sell and return to America in 1923. On the Ellis Island manifest, the destination is listed as Mascuty, but there is no town with that name. However, there is a Mascutah, Illinois just a few miles east of Belleville and in Belleville is a street named Mascutah. Mascutah Avenue runs between

Belleville and the town of Mascutah. This most likely is the location of the family either on this avenue or in the town. They began settling back in Belleville area and working to settle in but their son William had moved to California and returned for a visit and encouraged them to move there. After a trip to California and back, the sold out and moved to California around 1935.

First living with there son William until about 1942 when William moved to the Yuba City area, John and Maria moved with son Albert who was working in the farms in San Benito County. However, John died in 1944. Maria continued living with Albert for a few more years then moving in with son Charles about 1950 who lived in the Garden Valley area of El Dorado county. Maria was born south of Gelsenkirchen in 1879 but her family moved to Gelsenkirchen when the family was very young. She was the oldest of 13 Children and was engaged in helping with the family. At the age of 16 she went to work in a bucket factory; but all her earnings were collected by her father. However, she saved some money by not telling her father she had a raise. She bought a corset and her father found out and beat her with it and made her stay at home for a few weeks. As a result the bucket factory fired her because of her absence.

She then found work with a local Burgermeister cleaning and helping his invalid wife. However, the Burgermeister saw how her father treated her and took all her earnings; he helped her get a job with a local hotel and beer garden in Shalke. The Burgermeister would not tell Maria's father where she was and thus began her independence from her family. This is where she met John Fuhs and they were married just after her 20th birthday with the support of the Burgermeister. However, both families attended the wedding held in The Beer Garden Maria was working.

Charles John died in Garden Valley, El Dorado, California, USA, on December 28, 1982, at the age of 81.^[45]

His parents brought him to America when he was about seven months old arriving with his mother and older brother on 3 February 1902. His father having arrived in September 1901. Leaving family and a homeland, his parents sought to find new horizons and a new place for home. However, based on the birth place of the children, the family moved around a lot. It is said Charlie's father was always looking for work. Ohio, Illinois, Wisconsin, North Dakota, Montana and California are the most notable states the family has lived.

In the 1920's, Charles was working in a foundry that an accident caused him to lose his right eye. However, that did not deter his ability. He did many jobs without anyone realizing he has a single eye. He wore a glass eye that helped the illusion and made his face appear normal in every way. Charles also worked as a cow hand in Montana for a number of years. Among his greatest assets with one eye was his ability to shot a gun very accurately. In later part of 1942, Charlie was inducted into the

Army, but soon after his induction, a law was passed that no one over age of 35 was to serve in the Army. Soon after that, about March/April 1943, he was released from the Army. During his time in the Army, his one eye soon became known as the best Sharp shooter in his outfit. Because he was such a good shot, the shooting range became a boring experience, so he would demonstrate shooting talents by performing trick shots for the troops. He was assigned to Battery #1-306-CA, in Hawthorne, California after basic training at Fort Ord in Monterey, California. As the family moved, so did Charles. Three of the brothers came to California where new careers were found and many started there married lives in California. Other siblings remained in Illinois as there home.

In the early 1940's, he came to California to stay permanently and soon found love with Mary Ruth. However, after their marriage, he was inducted into the Army for a brief time. After his discharge, Charles joined his wife and become a heavy equipment operator working with his brother Albert. Among his first tasks, he was involved with the first rough of land preparation for the Pebble Beach golf course.

Charles at some point in his life was also an extra working in early silent films. He was involved with such actors as Gabby Hayes and other cowboy film actors. During these films he was working as a ranch hand and was very good at horsemanship. Some thing he learned working as a "cowboy" or ranch had in Montana.

During their life time, Charles and Mary Ruth lived in the Santa Clara Valley, that included Hollister, San Benito, Ca. & Davenport, Santa Cruz County, Ca. About 1946 they moved to El Dorado County just east of Sacramento, California. There they lived for a short time in Greenwood, El Dorado, California and in1947 moved to their last home in Garden Valley, El Dorado, California.

In Garden Valley, Charles was operating heavy equipment in logging; and in 1960 he entered his last job for the Georgetown, El Dorado, Ca. water

company. In 1966 he retired and enjoyed the life of leisure.

Charlie's greatest past time is when he could be found in his boat with a fishing line working the water Most of his time was spent in for bass and cat fish. a small lake only about 1/2 mile from the Garden Valley home. However, he enjoyed various lakes and water sources around the El Dorado County hills and took pride in his ability to bring home his limit of One of his greatest pets was his dog Boots. A small brown dog of about 20 pounds. Boots was most skillful at running raccoons up a tree. The "Charlie" would come along with his shot gun and bring the raccoon to the ground and then properly disposing of it's lifeless body. Charlie, as most people new him, always ensured he had his vehicles in running shape and took pride in his automobiles.

The home they moved into in Garden Valley was a small building barely big enough for 1 person let along a family of four. After several years in that building, a prefabricated home was purchased and placed on the property that provided a 3 bedroom home for the family that provided a suitable home for them. After about 15 years, Charlie demolished the old building and built a garage on the property. Their quarter acre home was passed on to their children until it was sold in the 1980s. Charlie was a great guy who loved his fishing excursions working the lures for bass and catfish; and how he could tell the tales. He could also do his part to maintain cars and repair them. He was a handy guy learning many of his tricks during the days as a ranch hand. Charlie was a will known guy and was loved by all. He enjoined the family life and remained close to his and his wife's family. Charlie's memory is a picture of a great man, husband, father and a great friend to many.

Based on information from family members, the following story of his life is presented.

Charles came to America in 1901 traveling with his mother and brother Paul on a four week journey to

New York. they processed through Ellis Island, then boarded a train where they met their father and first lived in Dillonvale, Ohio. Here they lived until 1903 and moved to Illinois. Again in 1910, the family relocated to Minnesota, they onto South and North Dakota when finally the family set up home on 180 acre homestead in Montana.

Charles began working after 2nd grade while the family was living in Montana to help support the family. When the family moved back to Illinois in 1917, Charles worked in the coal mines as proof of his certificate as a coal miner obtained in 1918.

Charles remained in America when his parents moved to Germany. He is known to obtain his miners certificate in 1918 in Illinois. However, in 1920 he is found per census report working as a farm hand in Illinois. In 1921 when the family moved to Germany, Charles remained in America. While working in a foundry, Charles had an accident and lost one eye. It is known that he Charles did go back to Montana where he worked on ranches and spent time training horses and working in Canada and Montana areas. He was known to be a pretty fair handler of horses. As a result, he did work with the Silent Movies.

Charles became one the principles hired to work with his horses in Silent Films and did play some roles in some of the films but it unknown what details tell us about his film career. Some of those films were filmed in the Niles Canyon area near Fremont, California. Charles was a traveling man and did make many trips (according to stories he told his children) between California and Illinois. However, in 1942 he married and settled in California.

In 1942 he spent a few months in the United States Army, but was discharged as rules changed that no man over the age of 38 was to be in the military. However, part of the provision was to prove you would have a job to go directly to and also would help support the war effort. Through his brother William, Charles did secure a job and was discharged from the Army. He was a one-eyed sharp shooter and used to demonstrate shooting skills for the Army

personnel.

He became involved with operating heavy earth moving equipment joining his brother William. He worked on many projects from Monterey to Santa Cruz. William was working in the El Dorado area when his second child was born. So William and Charles traded jobs in 1947 and Charles and family moved to El Dorado County and making their home there for the remainder of their lives. Charles was working heavy equipment for many years then taking a job with a local water company until he retired.

Mary Ruth Bridgham Fuhs corresponded with John by writing to him while in prison. She received letters in return; the letters were noticeably reviewed by prison authorities before they were mailed.

This is a story given to this researcher by another: Based on family information passed along, John was with two (News artcle states 3) other men who were committing burglaries. When arrested, the three were charged with multiple rapes and the burglaries. However, John stated he did not rape anyone as he was married. The other men had been committing rapes between burglaries but John was not part of that crime. However in this era, anyone associated with a crime was assumed part of the crime and all three men were charged and convicted of rape and burglaries. Each was given 119 years in prison. John, serving his sentence at the Menard Illinois State Prison [1940 Census found all 4 in Joiliet State Prison], was released in 1964 and lived with his sister Ida until his death in 1967. She states the birth and death dates of this record and the marriages. Syvilla's ancestry traces back to early 1600s to Huellhorst, Westfalen Preussen. Westfalen is the same area the Fuhs surname is found. Syvilla's parents are farmers. Her father was married twice with 7 children of the first marriage and Syvilla's mother Magdalena Helen Mueller having 5 children (as noted above in 1920 census). Syvilla's father and family are well noted for participation with the local church in Stookley and contributing to its support. Syvilla's grandfather Caspar Heinrich Heidenreich emigrated to America in 1847 arriving at the port of

Philadelphia on the ship Brig George Delius on 6/11/1947. First name is also determined from this posting. Syvilla's father died on 9 January 1924. Her grandfather first came to St. Louis, the moving to Stookey, Illinois, he established a farm and this began this families life in America.

Karen (Carrie) did answer an email inquiry and confirmed her research resulted in the information as stated above. Also, she quoted information from an obituary of Syvilla and that provided the notes for her children and discovery of some other information for Darlean's children. Karen is a great niece to Syvilla, but she never meet her.

She wrote:

"John (Hanrahan), This was the first database I made when I started on the family Heidenreich, and much of it is not notated -- I will have to go back over everything and properly note my sources, etc. I looked through the copies of the obituaries I have, and Arnold Kuhn was the second marriage for Syvilla. In the 1981 obituary of her brother, she is listed as Mrs. Sylvia Kuhn. In the 1924 obituary of her father, she is listed as "Cihila Fusz" - obviously, the reporter taking notes didn't get the spelling!!

According to her obituary, her son and daughter-inlaw, John and Annette Fuhs were in Belleville at the time of her death; son Cordell Fuhs was in California Valley, CA, daughter Darlean Aimo was in Grass Valley, CA, and daughter and son-in-law JoAnn and Ronald Pannier were in Belleville. Son Norman preceded her in death. As this was only 15 years ago, perhaps they are all still in the same towns, and you may be able to track them down."

From this became the basis for some research to date that has resulted in the information listed for her children.




Figure 10: Fuhs John WW I Draft Reg (1/29/2018 4:06:33 PM) Draft Registration




Figure 17: Maria Anna Schmidt's Orbituary (January 13, 1960)




Figure 19: Fuhs Maria Arrival 1902 (4/10/2020 12:42:19 AM) Maria, John & Paul arrival in 1902 via Ellis Island




Figure 22: Montana, County Naturalization Records, 1867-1970 Montana State Historical Society; Helena, Montana; Petition and Record, 1915-1918




Figure 23: Montana, County Naturalization Records, 1867-1970 Montana State Historical Society; Helena, Montana; Petition and Record, 1915-1918




Figure 25: 1910 United States Federal Census (1910)




Figure 26: 1920 United States Federal Census (1920)




Figure 27: 1930 United States Federal Census (1930)





Figure 29: U.S. Passport Applications, 1795-1925

Of the parish priest we have received a copy of the entry in the church register about the marriage of our great-grandparents.

This copy you find in this letter as enclosure.

The entry isn't the marriage but the "notice of intended marriage" in the native village, therefore the marriage date is missing also in the 3rd column from the right side, "month and day of marriage".

In the 6th column from the right side "on which date marriage was announced" you find a notice: "24th post trinitatis", in the year 1858 is this November 14 th .

At this date, the marriage has been announced in the native church.

In the last column from the right side you find a notice: "Wurden in Essen copulirt durch Pastor Gräber"

That means: "marriage in the city of Essen by the priest Gräber" and therefore we have kontacted the Protestant parish in Essen City. Essen is a neighboring city in the south of Gladbeck.

We have found the entry of the marriage there on January 2nd, 1859.

How I have in the latest letter mentioned, we have contacted the protestant parish church in Alpen.

Of the parish priest we have received a copy of the entry in the church register about the marriage of our great-grandparents.

This copy you find in this letter as enclosure.

The entry isn't the marriage but the "notice of intended marriage" in the native village, therefore the marriage date is missing also in the 3rd column from the right side, "month and day of marriage".

In the 6th column from the right side "on which date marriage was announced" you find a notice: "24th post trinitatis", in the year 1858 is this November 14 th .

At this date, the marriage has been announced in the native church.

In the last column from the right side you find a notice: "Wurden in Essen copulirt durch Pastor Gräber"

That means: "marriage in the city of Essen by the priest Gräber" and therefore we have kontacted the Protestant parish in Essen City. Essen is a neighboring city in the south of Gladbeck.

Anna's ancestors in the mid 1700s began an emmigration to America. They boarded boats and rode up the Rhine River to the Netherlands where they hoped to gain passage to America, destination was Pennsylvania. However, many were taken advantage of thier iggornance of the situation and their money or possessions taken for passage but never received the promised ship boarding.

As a result, many of these imigrants were stranded and eventually made a pack with the cities of Kleve, Emmerich, Huissen and Goch. For land, they would develop it and grow crops and this is how much of these town lands were developed and obtained by these emigrants.

In the town of Pfalzdorf is were many of the Anna's ancestors settled. However, the location of this town is very near the boarder today of Germany and the Netherlands and reason we find the story of her son Johann's birth in Holland. Family stories state she was homesick and pregnant. So while visiting relatives in Holland, the long trip and train ride cased her to go into labor and give birth to Johann during this trip. However, no proof at this time has been found of the record of birth. It has been stated by family that all Fuhs children except Johann were born in Germany.

However, additional comments from family state Paul Fuhs was traveling in the Holland area when he met Anna. Under old customs, children where bounded to marriage by parents at young ages; however, neither Anna or Paul were under such bondage and thus they were married. this indicates the Pleines family may have been living within the boarders as when know of Holland and not Germany at the time of marriage. No confirmation of this fact has been found at this time.

Rumor: circa 1929-1933 Johann & Maria returned to Germany. To Gelsenkirchen, Germany. Johann didn't like the USA and hard to find work there. In Germany they bought a "beer garden". This place was the location of their first meeting and was the work place for Maria at the time of their meeting. The German Marc (money) was becoming worthless. As a result, the German government was in the early stages of persecution of Jews. Jewish ancestry was the background of Maria and was in her best interest to leave the home land. The couple returned to the United States.

Based on information from family members, the following story of his life has been developed.

As some stories and some records found in US research state Johann's birth location is "Holland"; one story states his mother was traveling visiting relatives in Holland. The long trip on trains is reason that she began labor and gave birth to Johann while

in Holland. Her visit to the "Holland" area was close to the boarder of Germany and Holland of today. Her family emigrated to that area in the late 1700s on their way out of the country but did not secure passage on a ship. They settled in the boarder area of Germany & Holland which was under French control for a few years in the early 1800s.

However, based on research and birth document found indicate that Johann was born in Gelsenkirchen area of Germany. Ffor this record, he is recorded as born in Gelsenkirchen, Germany. Johann was raised in this area and when old enough to work, he was required to go to work and turn over his wages to his parents.

Johann began work in the Coal Mines when he was 16 years old. At age 21 he had to serve two years in the Army. While in the Army he was stationed in Gelsenkirchen. This is where he met Maria Schmidt when she was working in a Beer Garden. When Johann's Army service ended, they were married.

While Maria's parents were opposed to this marriage, and the fact Maria was pregnant at the time of marriage, Johann & Maria were married in The Beer Garden with support from her employer. A large party was held in the Beer Garden and attended by both parents of Johann & Maria and their families. Living with Johann's parents, Johann & Maria soon decided to move to America after a visit from Johann's sister Maria who lived in America.

Johann entered America through Ellis Island in 1901 arriving with his sister Anna. In February 1902, Maria and two eldest sons arrived and joined Johann who found work in a coal mine in Dillonville, Jefferson County, Ohio. Both entered America through Ellis Island then riding a train to Ohio.

They first lived in Dillonvale, Ohio while Johann had a job in a coal mine. However after a few years the work slowed and they moved to Fairview Heights, Illinois. Here life began to prosper until Johann had worked very hard in the coal mine and spent many long hours building a family home. He soon became stricken with rheumatism and the family had to move

to Belleville where Johann began treatment by traveling between Belleville and St. Louis. Doctors suggested he move to a drier climate and through a friend, Johann left the family and moved to Minnesota. Soon Maria had to move from the home with the family due to lack of funds; Johann sent money for the family to come to Minnesota. Johann was working as a farm laborer but soon decided to follow the farm equipment to So. Dakota and then No. Dakota. But work became slim and the family soon moved to Montana in 1912 were Johann was obtained a Land Patent in 1917 for 320 acres. Working the land, cold winters, crops that did good one year but another spoiled due to a hail storm but the family was beginning to prosper again. While in So. Dakota, Johann applied and took his test for citizenship; In 1916, Johann received his naturalization papers while living in Montana that also naturalized Maria, Paul and Charles, all other children born in U.S. With the naturalization, Johann changed his given name to John.

Then World War I started and because the Fuhs family were German, their friends and neighbors began to turn against him. Threats to the family caused John to sell out and move the family back to Illinois. However, older son Paul stayed in Montana, joined the Army and eventually married in 1921. Johann & family moved back to a small community near Belleville, Illinois where John still had German friends. John went to work in the coal mines and soon purchased a home for his family. However, John and Maria longed to visit their family that they had not heard from since 1902; they decided to return to Germany in in late 1920. John & Maria took the 3 youngest children with them to Germany and the 4 older boys remained in America. Germany, they purchased an apartment with a Tavern on the ground floor. But due to the poor times after the war and the value of German money was worthless, living there was very difficult. So they decided to sell and return to America in 1923. On the Ellis Island manifest, the destination is listed as Mascuty, but there is no town with that name. However, there is a Mascutah, Illinois just a few miles east of Belleville and in Belleville is a street named Mascutah. Mascutah Avenue runs between

Belleville and the town of Mascutah. This most likely is the location of the family either on this avenue or in the town. They began settling back in Belleville area and working to settle in but their son William had moved to California and returned for a visit and encouraged them to move there. After a trip to California and back, the sold out and moved to California around 1935.

First living with there son William until about 1942 when William moved to the Yuba City area, John and Maria moved with son Albert who was working in the farms in San Benito County. However, John died in 1944. Maria continued living with Albert for a few more years then moving in with son Charles about 1950 who lived in the Garden Valley area of El Dorado county. By 1951, Albert had moved to work in the farm areas south of Yuba City and Maria lived with Alberts family in 1955 for a few years; she then was living in an apartment in Yuba City until her death in 1960.




Figure 30: AnnaPleines (10/4/2020 12:27:45 PM)





Maria was born south of Gelsenkirchen in 1879 but her family moved to Gelsenkirchen when the family was very young. She was the oldest of 13 Children and was engaged in helping with the family. At the age of 16 she went to work in a bucket factory; but all her earnings were collected by her father. However, she saved some money by not telling her father she had a raise. She bought a corset and her father found out and beat her with it and made her stay at home for a few weeks. As a result the bucket factory fired her because of her absence.

She then found work with a local Burgermeister cleaning and helping his invalid wife. However, the Burgermeister saw how her father treated her and took all her earnings; he helped her get a job with a local hotel and beer garden in Shalke. The Burgermeister would not tell Maria's father where she was and thus began her independence from her family. This is where she met John Fuhs and they were married just after her 20th birthday with the support of the Burgermeister. However, both families attended the wedding held in The Beer Garden Maria was working.

They lived with Johann's parents until 1901 when they immigrated to America.



She then found work with a local Burgermeister cleaning and helping his invalid wife. However, the Burgermeister saw how her father treated her and took all her earnings; he helped her get a job with a local hotel and beer garden in Shalke. The Burgermeister would not tell Maria's father where she was and thus began her independence from her family. This is where she met John Fuhs and they were married just after her 20th birthday with the support of the Burgermeister. However, both families attended the wedding held in The Beer Garden Maria was working.

They lived with Johann's parents until 1901 when they immigrated to America.







eventually lead to the Pleines family settling in the northern area of Germany.

The following story was excepted from the book "175 years of Louisendorf" by Josef Jörissen, published by Pfälzerbund am Niederrhein, 47574 Goch (Pfalzdorf).

In 1740 colonist from Pfalz came to the lower Rhein. Three large Rheinships anchored June 1741 at Schenkenschanz. On board were emigrants. Religious reasons and economic hardships (frost in winter of 1740/41) that had made farmers poor, were the reason for the emigration to leave their homeland. Many emigrants who were not willing to denounce their religion (protestants) had already shipped downriver to the Netherlands and from there to America. The target was Pennsylvania, a heaven of religious refugees. Some of these emigrants were brought to the states on British ships.

Others got into the hands of bad agents that made profits from the bad luck of the emigrants. They brought them to Rotterdam (Netherlands) and left them there, where they, poor and robbed from all possessions, became a burden of the country.

Only a few who could make arrangements with English captains for passage to the USA could travel on to Rotterdam. The others hoped to get permission from the government, but failed.

The ship owners Dietz and Eichelberg did not want to wait any longer and asked for payment so that they could return upriver. The passengers did not pay because the contract said to pay after arrival in Rotterdam, and so a judge was asked. The judge was unable to make peace and asked the higher court, the war and domain champer in Kleve. This court finally ordered the passengers to leave the ships.

On July 17 the unlucky passengers had to leave the ships with their belongings. The ship owners left immediately. A group of 20 families with 130 people, asked the Kleve court "to get a piece of land for farming and that they would be good citizens under the majesty".

The court acted fast and asked July 18 the cities of Kleve, Emmerich, Huissen and Goch, if they could accommodate the emigrants. The cities of Kleve and Huissen said no quickly, but good news came from Goch. The city promised the emigrants land on the Goch Heide (heide is not very good land). On the good news the emigrants elected two deputies, Friedrich Conrad und Michael

Grossart, to contact the city. They went to see the land and on August 8 they gave a list of the families to the city.

On August 23 1741 a contract was signed between the city of Goch and the deputies in the amount of 130 hectares (320 acres), for five years free, five years half interest, and then full interest of 2 taler (4 per acre about).

The Pleines family has been been confirmed with some records found in civil and church records in the town of Kleve.

Johann Jacob married **Maria Agnesa Hohl** on July 28, 1739, in Sargenroth. They had eleven children: Anna, Maria, Maria, Johann, Johann, Anna, Maria, Johann, Jean, Maria and Anna.


