PREFACE

A few words about the research are needed.

Frist, it is important that I try to support the data with documents or media that support the data of each individual. This helps to validate and provide confirmation of the genealogy history recorded about a person and their families. In some cases I have seen many forms of data, but I only attached those that provide proof to help support my recordings. If I attached all I could find would provide too much for my computer files and overload the presentation.

In United States history are numerous varieties of record types that have been preserved. Each of these records provide the trail of the people and their documented history. There are many sources that provide information of this documented history. In this book are footnotes of the source documents or places this research has been recorded. There are so many types of sources to mention here, but this book provides some of that information as recorded in my Family Tree Maker (FTM) file.

Some of the data has been found or learned but have no supporting documentation. Why? Because to maintain limited electronic files; and that some of the information has been discovered on many sources. In some cases, it is real information known by people of these families.

Ireland is divided by two territories. Northern Ireland, and The Republic of Ireland (the Irish Free State). Northern Ireland is under the control of British rule. The Republic of Ireland is its own sovereignty nation. The name "Éire" is the nickname or name used for Ireland.

First, one has to understand the land divisions of countries. This helps understanding to find people and where they lived.

One important note about individual and family names. Each surname coupled with given names you will find many of the same name or combination of names. Therefore, other items such as parents, birth, death, marriage, territory, and possible other items are required to ensure one has identified the current person and family.

Enjoy reading, but there is so much to learn. This document will provide a base for anyone wishing to do genealogy research or just adding to this family information.

RESEARCH NOTES

Doing genealogy research is a long term and time-consuming task. If one is doing it for real, they will collect a great amount of data about life of people, the territory they lived, and learn about the uniting of families. For this researcher, there is much learned that is way above what is taught about history in school classes. Research can include working with on-line resources in today's Internet and can include travel to obtain information and documentation from Federal, State, County, City, or towns from records they kept. Cemetery records are a great source found on-line via the Internet.

There are many avenues why folks do genealogy research. For this researcher, I am not writing a book, I am trying to learn of past family and a small bit about them. I am not recording every detail that is possible. If I did, I would not be able to share what I have discovered in this book and I would still be on the road to discovery.

What is in this book is free to all to read, print, or share as they desire. This information is public and can be found by others; therefore, I am not doing this for any monies or profit, just for the pleasure of doing this research and a great retirement hobby for me.

This research has been ongoing between 2000 to 2021 to compile and record in this book. There are many resources, these are just some of them.

The following is a sampling about what I used to do research.

- 2. "Family Search" [https://wwwfamilysearchh.org/en/] (Free to the public] web site that is open to anyone. This site is created and supported by The Church of Latter-Day Saints in Salt Lake City, Utah (aka Mormon Church or LDS).
- 3. Using an Internet browser to search by varies names or phrases does help locate some information.
- 4. Primary source documents such as: US Census, Birth, Death certificates, cemetery records, civil documents, and immigration records or other documents that support the validation of family names and their link to relatives.
- 5. Find-a-Grave: [https://www.findagrave.com/]. In the attached files you may see the term "*Memorial ID*" with a number sequence. By going to the Find a Grave web site and entering this Memorial ID, that will take you to the grave information that has been recorded by folks who go to cemeteries and document the graves. In some cases, you will see the grave maker and other information folks have recorded for that person. In some cases, there are links to parents, siblings, and children along with spouses that all have a Memorial ID recorded.
- 6. Historical Societies and Internet Genealogy resources

NOTES:

1) ANCESTOR: Also known as a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.

2) DESCENDANT: Are descending after a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.

- Meaning of "direct descendant" as opposed to "indirect descendant"
- 1. A direct descendant is someone who can trace their lineage by "child" relationships all the way back to the desired ancestor.

2. A non-direct descendant has to go through a "cousin" or "by marriage" or some other nonchild relationship in order to find the desired ancestor.

Definition of genealogy.

- 1. An account of the descent of a person, family, or group from an ancestor or from older forms.
- 2. Regular descent of a person, family, or group of organisms from a progenitor or older form: pedigree. The study of family ancestral lines.

- 2) Correct Postings.
- 3) Reliable Sources.
- 4) Factual Information to a *Nuclear Family*.

A nuclear family is a one set of parents and their children.

This book contains the facts, who, what, where, when, but not the story of *A FAMILY*. But it is the story of *MANY FAMILIES* along with some information of basic facts and notes.

It is about the descendants or ancestors of the surnamed person related to all people listed in this book. Note: over time the surname may change as this was due to a language interpretation of the words from another language to English. In some cases, it is how a person hearing a name pronounced and thought what they heard and consequently spelled the name differently.

Another fact, naming of children was set forth by family protocol in family history. Therefore, caution is required as one will see the same names in many families resulting with the same names used very often and can only be identified by parents, birth, death dates and/or other factors.

It is amazing how often there is a close resemblance for relatives separated by generations.

There are many paper trails of recorded facts and information. The discovery of those paper trails helps find the information about families that provide the ancestral connections to people. This book is about those finding but begins with a known person and provides their descendants or ancestors and all related folks that have been recorded in my files.

DISCLAIMER

The program creating this book is a great tool. It uses data from the Family Tree Maker (FTM) data base; However, the words or sentences that this program provides can, sometimes, or may not have the proper syntax of the English language. That is not an error, but it is a terrific programming task to make all the syntax blend with the data from FTM as best as possible. It is also dependent on my input that would help make the syntax of sentences look wrong when it may not be the case. It could be my error in data entry.

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Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of June 02, 2022.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children.

Any files/Media collected is attached to a person or family is pictured with each family.

The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. Each spouse and their children is a "Nuclear Family".

For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family.

Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Family of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Charles Kent are presented in a form of an enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose ancestors are listed in the later chapters.

The chapter titled "<HeadlineFamilies>" provides details (as known as of this publication date) for the ancestors of Charles Kent.

There is a chapter for each generation.


Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 312 individuals, of whom 154 are male and 158 are female. Of the 283 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 60.5 years. Of these, 144 males averaged 63.6 years, and 139 females averaged 57.3 years. The longest living male was William Hyde (1606–1881), who died aged 275. The longest living female was Lydia Hazen (1694–1794), who died aged 100.

1.0-2 Charles Francis Kent was born on Friday, June 05, 1863, in Davenport, Scott, Iowa, USA.^[1-3] He was the son of Charles H. Kent (1.1-3).

Charles Francis achieved a degree in Druggist, Northwestern University, in 1888. He was employed in Druggist.

Charles Francis died at Renal Failure in DeWitt, Clinton, Ia., US, on June 21, 1944, at the age of 81.^[2, 3] He was buried in DeWitt, Clinton, Ia., US (Elmwood Cemetery).^[2]

Person Notes: He graduated from Davenport High School in 1879. He worked in Davenport for H.A. Emeis, druggist, and for Frank Nadler, druggist, and then attended North Western University, Department of Pharmacy, graduating in July, 1888. He was a part time employee in Chicago of Fuller & Fuller, Wholesale druggist. He also worked in a drug store in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. In April 1892 the Kent & Co. partnership composed of Charles F. Kent, E.S. Ballard and J.W. Ballard bought from C.V. Baxter a drug store in De Witt, Iowa. C.F. Kent was proprietor and Harry Ballard and Abner Beard were clerks. In 1909, Charles F. Kent bought the interest of the Ballards and became the sole proprietor. He continued in the drug business in the same location until September, 1939 when the business was sold to Paul Ginther.

Charles F. Kent & Elizabeth Anderson lived at three locations in De Witt before acquiring the Crimp property in West De Witt, which was owned by youngest daughter Majorie then by her daughter Jean Henderson-Schmidt until sold in 1991.

Mr. Kent was active in civic affairs, serving on the school board, city council, library board and other civic interests. He continued in the drug business in the same location until his retirement in 1939, working from early morning until 9 or 10 evenings and on Sunday mornings. Their six children were educated at De Witt public schools.

On May 9, 1943, Mr. and Mrs. Kent celebrated their 50th (golden) wedding anniversary, sharing it with their many friends and acquaintences in DeWitt. (see "History of Scott County, Iowa")

until 1925. He was the curator of photographic apparatus, and the consulting photographer, from 1936 until 1947. Mr. Kent founded University Photo Service, and was manager from 1947 until 1963. He served as a part-time photographer of special projects with Photo Service for the next twelve years, retiring in 1975. He died July 17, 1984.

The importance of Fred Kent's work goes beyond his many years of producing student's graduation photos and recording sporting events. His detailed photographs of the 1922 restoration of Old Capitol on the University of Iowa campus aided in subsequent restorations of the building.

Mr. Kent photographed everyday scenes and the extraordinary. The Daily Iowan newspaper reported on November 23, 1934, that Mr. Kent designed a new camera to quickly and inexpensively photograph material for screen projection, improving upon the Recordak machine. He pioneered the use of stereographs in medicine, producing threedimensional pictures for doctors. In 1947, Eastman Kodak commissioned him to write the first manual for medical photography. Mr. Kent also holds the honor of first recipient of the Iowa City Historic Preservation Commission Award in 1984 for documenting the growth of the area through his photographs.

Of the tens of thousands of images he created, Mr. Kent considered his most famous to be the now ubiquitous pose of Nile Kinnick ready to pass the football, which Mr. Kent recorded in 1939, the year Kinnick was named All-American.

A portion of Mr. Kent's collection was transferred to University Archives from the Center for Media Production, where many of Mr. Kent's sports photos and negatives remain. Additional Kent images of Iowa and Iowa City are located at the State Historical Society of Iowa, Iowa City. From: lib.ujowa.edu

After moving to California was the only time he didn't do the job of painting and decorating. They owned a small grocery store and he was the butcher in the store. 


Figure 7: Kent-Henderson 1940 (8/5/2020 3:19:26 PM)




Figure 8: Kent FW Kids1952 (9/16/2020 9:05:38 PM) L-R: Frederick, Maude, Gordon, Donald, Helen, Marjorie At the Kent Home




Figure 15: Iowa, State Census Collection, 1836-1925





Figure 17: Iowa, Marriage Records, 1880-1940 (1893) Iowa Department of Public Health; Des Moines, Iowa; Series Title: Iowa Marriage Records, 1880-1922; Record Type: Marriage




Figure 18: Kent Charles H 2 (11/17/2019 2:55:33 PM) Charles H Kent




Figure 24: 1880 United States Federal Census Year: 1880; Census Place: Davenport, Scott, Iowa; Roll: 364; Page: 678B; Enumeration District: 280




Figure 23: 1870 United States Federal Census Year: 1870; Census Place: Davenport Ward 6, Scott, Iowa; Roll: M593_418; Page: 383A; Family History Library Film: 545917



ROBINSON SEMINARY

This institution was established by the liberal bequest of the late William Robinson, a native of Exeter, N. H. It was partially opened April 15, 1867, and reorganized and fully opened September 21, 1869. The seminary building is an elegant and substantial brick structure, beautifully located, with fine grounds, sixteen acres in extent adorned with a great variety of trees and shrubs. Near the seminary buildings are basket-ball grounds, croquet grounds and a tennis court. The trustees are constantly striving to make the seminary a school of the highest type. With this end in view the course of study is arranged to meet the desire of the founder who said in his will: "The course of instruction should be such as will tend to make female scholars equal in all the practical duties of life, such a course of education as will enable them to compete, and successfully, too, with their brothers throughout the world, when they have to take their part in the actual of life."

The addition of a home economics course has given to pupils not preparing for college the means of acquiring detailed knowledge of the art and science of housekeeping. This course aims to bring to them the highest ideals of home life.

Robinson Seminary is on the list of schools approved by the New England College Entrance Certificate Board. This list comprises the best schools in New England, and assures to students who satisfactorily complete their course of study the privilege of entering without examination all New England colleges using the certificate system, among which are Mount Holyoke, Simmons, Smith, Wellesley , and several co-educational colleges. The seminary is also on the list of schools approved by Vassar College. Trustees and faculty endeavor to make the influences of the school of the highest and most uplifting type. The seminary grounds with all their natural beauty and the school's splendid art collection cannot fail to make their influence felt upon the life and the work of the students.

The late Mr. Henry C. Moses, for many years president of the board of trustees, presented to the art department a very valuable collection of casts and photographs to illustrate architecture, sculpture, and painting. This collection has been arranged in the corridors of the seminary in the best manner for examination and study. The assembly hall is adorned with illustrations of Italian Renaissance, the study room with casts and photographs of Greek and Roman art, and the other school rooms with works of art and pictures illustrative of the subjects taught in each room.

The late Mrs. Cora Kent Bell, a member of the first graduating class and long president of the Alumnae Association, gave \$1,000, to be expended in the interest of the school. This sum, which was generously increased by gifts from Mrs. Bell's mother, the late Mrs. Hervey Kent, has been expended in the purchase of a library of Christian art, in memory of the donor. The library consists of books treating of Christian art as depicted in the principal

countries of Europe and in the United States, and of an extensive collection of mounted photographs. Both books and photographs have been catalogued in a card index system by subjects, countries, and artists, and, arranged in substantial cases in a room known as the Memorial Room.

The room is finished in quartered oak with walls painted in two shades of green. The cases and furniture are of oak. In a large case are arranged engravings.

The walls are adorned with several fine engravings,

with a very fine oil portrait of Mrs. Bell, by Mrs. Eva D. Cowdery, of Boston, and with the beautiful painting "Across the Brook," by Madame Elizabeth Gardner Bouguereau, which has been presented by the artist to Exeter.

The Memorial Room is open for the use of its library during school hours, The use is not limited to members of the school. The books and photographs under certain restrictions are loaned to clubs or individuals of known responsibility for the purpose of studying Christian art.


Figure 28: Asa Kent (Late 1800s) (2/27/2021 4:29:49 PM) Photo is a scan of a daguerreotype image. a photograph taken by an early photographic process employing an iodine-sensitized silvered plate and mercury vapor. Invented by a Frenchman in early 1800s.




Figure 30: New Hampshire, Wills and Probate Records, 1643-1982 Wills, 1799-1869; Author: New Hampshire. Probate Court (Cheshire County); Probate Place: Cheshire, New Hampshire





Figure 31: U.S., Revolutionary War Rolls, 1775-1783

"Isaac and Rachel Kent took up this challenge and became part of a group now known as the "Planters". Their trip is described in "Planters and Pioneers" by Esther Clark Wright:

On May 17, 1760, 25 heads of families, making with wives and children 45 passengers, were embarked at Boston on board the "Charming Molly". 




Figure 36: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988

There are 3 Kent families who came from England to the Colonies before 1646, they are Richard Kent of the Newbury line Thomas Kent of the Gloucester IIne John, Joseph, and Joshua Kent of the Dedham, Charleston, and Rhode Island lines.

John Kent lived in Dedham, Ma, then Charleston of Massachuttes Bay Colony. Charleston later became a suburb of Boston in Middlesex County, Massachusetts.

While there are many John Kent's in the early 1600 colonial period in America, there have been many who have debunked the association with the Richard Kent of Newbury, Ma. and his son John Kent born in 1645. In 1645 is when the Kent brothers came to Dedham, Ma.




Figure 39: Kent Families by Briggs (between 1600 and 1800)




Figure 42: John Kent, Son of Richard Knet Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988 (1645)




Figure 41: John Kent of Dedham (1645)




Figure 44: Kent John and Hannah Gizold marriage (1662) Marriage Record from Massachusetts:




Figure 47: Kent John and Joshua (3/2/2020 10:53:29 AM)




Figure 48: Kent Book History and Genealogy of the Kent Family Richard Kent (3/2/2020 12:34:32 PM) This is cover to a book in the Genealogy records. Thiw book has wrong information.




Figure 49: Kent Book History of Suffield (3/2/2020 12:34:32 PM) This is cover to a book in the Genealogy records.




Figure 52: Kent Book Tenney Family (3/2/2020 12:34:32 PM) This is cover to a book in the Genealogy records.




Figure 56: Griswold family : England-America (1600s)




Figure 57: John Kent & Hannah Grizwold Marriage (21 Mar 1662) Dedham, Ma




Figure 58: Genealogies of the different families bearing the name of Kent in the United States (1645) John Kent of England and Dedham, Ma




Figure 60: Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988 (July 20, 1645) "John ..son of Richard Kent borne July 20th", 1645"




Figure 61: John Kent of Dedham 1st Church (1652)




Figure 62: John Kent of Dedham now Charleston Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988 Church Release (April 13, 1671) Received in Church in Charleston, Ma Page 17 6th from top, left side.

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Figure 63: Kent Surnames Massachusetts, Town and Vital Records, 1620-1988 (1700)





Figure 64: Hannah Griswold The New England Historical & Genealogical Register, 1847-2011 (4 Mar 1644) The Translator made an error. The Parenthesis is the day of the month and there are two towns listed. Some folks are listed born in wrong town.

There are 3 Kent families who came from England to the Colonies before 1646, they are Richard Kent of the Newbury line Thomas Kent of the Gloucester IIne John, Joseph, and Joshua Kent of the Dedham, Charleston, and Rhode Island lines.

-John Kent lived in Dedham, Ma, then Charleston of Massachuttes Bay Colony. Charleston later became a suburb of Boston in Middlesex County, Massachusetts.

While there are many John Kent's in the early 1600 colonial period in America, there have been many who have debunked the association with the Richard Kent of Newbury, Ma. and his son John Kent born in 1645. In 1645 is when the Kent brothers came to Dedham, Ma.

All accounts state Joseph and brothers, Joshua and John Kent came to the colonies in April 1645. Manifest states they came from Nayland (St. Stephen) is a village and former civil parish in the Stour Valley on the Suffolk side of the border between Suffolk and Essex in England.

However, the manifest found does not show Joseph in the listing. Thus, sometimes, they don't get listed as stated in some documents in research. However, all notes say they came together in 1645.

In a Court Case Joseph Testified he was 16 years old. This is in 1653. Thus he was born in 1637 and was about 7/8 years old coming to the colonies in 1645.

Around 1660-61, Joseph is no longer found in Braintree, MA records but begins appearing in Block Island, Washington, RI. Block Island was settled mostly by people from Braintree. Joseph is listed as one of the messengers or deputies from the Block Island, in May of 1664 to the first assembly of Rhode Island. This assembly set the charter and met in Newport, Newport, RI. His name is listed on the covenant of Swansea, Bristol, MA, in 1669. His name consistently appears on the town's documents about 1673.On 15 December 1673, he was admitted an inhabitant of Swansea. He is mentioned to be a freeman on 6 June 1682. He was on a committee to regulate the differences in division of Swansea lands on 7 July 1681.

From most accounts found, Joseph Kent settled in Bristol County, Massachusetts and they are found in towns noted below and other descendants found in Bristol County, Rhode Island. Most of this territory was organized after Joseph moved to this area and as the family grew, the changes in boundaries became part of the lives of this Kent family. Therefore, Kents are found living in these towns either before or after the boundary changes noted below.





Figure 67: New Hampshire, Marriage and Divorce Records, 1659-1947 New England Historical Genealogical Society; New Hampshire Bureau of Vital Records, Concord, New Hampshire





Figure 68: Abell family in America : Robert Abell of Rehoboth, Mass., his English ancestry and his descendants, other Abell families a







Figure 69: Hazen Lydia Baptism (10/1/2018 10:38:29 PM) Here, from p. 54 of the Tospfield, Ma., Vital Records, is the Record of Baptism for our 6th great aunt Lydia Hazen, the daughter of Thomas Hazen, on 9 Sep 1694 ...rdr



Son Capt Robert Abell settled in Weymouth, Massachusetts, and along with fellow Puritan merchant, Capt John West (1590-1659), traded in Virginia and Maryland, including St Mary's County, during the Commonwealth years.

During his time as a resident of Weymouth (1630-1643), his civic duties included serving on various types of juries (grand, petit and coroner's), and records indicate that he accumulated a small amount of land (about 7 acres). Like many immigrants, Robert Abell did not stay indefinitely in the first place he landed. In 1643, when the opportunity to join a newly founded town presented itself, he followed Reverend Samuel Newman (and the majority of his congregation) to a place the local Wampanoag tribe called Seekonk (a portion of which was later renamed "Rehoboth").

He came to the colonies in 1630 with the Winthrop Fleet. Robert Abell was an early settler of Weymuth. He followed Samuel Newman to Rehoboth, MA. in 1642 and applied for a land grant from Plymouth Court in 1643. Robert Abell may have been born in Stapenhill, Derbyshire, England. The Winthrop Fleet was a group of 11 ships led by John Winthrop out of a total of 16 funded by the Massachusetts Bay Company which together carried between 700 and 1,000 Puritans plus livestock and provisions from England to New England over the summer of 1630, during the first period of the Great Migration.



Son Capt Robert Abell settled in Weymouth, Massachusetts, and along with fellow Puritan merchant, Capt John West (1590-1659), traded in Virginia and Maryland, including St Mary's County, during the Commonwealth years.

Robert Abell's first recorded act in America (19 October 1630) was to apply to be a freeman in the recently founded village of Weymouth. On 18 May 1631, he took the freeman's oath.

During his time as a resident of Weymouth (1630-1643), his civic duties included serving on various types of juries (grand, petit and coroner's), and records indicate that he accumulated a small amount of land (about 7 acres). Like many immigrants, Robert Abell did not stay indefinitely in the first place he landed. In 1643, when the opportunity to join a newly founded town presented itself, he followed Reverend Samuel Newman (and the majority of his congregation) to a place the local Wampanoag tribe called Seekonk (a portion of which was later renamed "Rehoboth").

At the time of his death, Abell's estate "amounted to ± 354 17s. 9d. of which 'an house and land' accounted for ± 130 ."

He came to the colonies in 1630 with the Winthrop Fleet. Robert Abell was an early settler of Weymuth. He followed Samuel Newman to Rehoboth, MA. in 1642 and applied for a land grant from Plymouth Court in 1643. Robert Abell may have been born in Stapenhill, Derbyshire, England. The Winthrop Fleet was a group of 11 ships led by John Winthrop out of a total of 16 funded by the Massachusetts Bay Company which together carried between 700 and 1,000 Puritans plus livestock and provisions from England to New England over the summer of 1630, during the first period of the Great Migration.

His occupation was that of a Tavernkeeper, he had a special license to operate an ordinary cafe in 1656. He owned lot 28 in 1646/1651/1653. In Attleboro, North Purchase in 1658 along with Samuel Luther (his future son-in-law).



John Sr. BEAL, the emmigrant ancestor of the majority of BEAL descendants in America and Canada was said to be age 100 when he died in 1688. Thus his birth in Wymondham, Norfolkshire, England would have occurred about 1588. However, the first documented record of him appears on 8d 5m 1593 when he was baptised in the neighboring town of Wramplingham.

John Sr. "the centurian" BEAL was married twice. He married (1st) the widow Frances (RIPLEY) TAYLOR 11d 6m 1616 at Wymondham and they had six children born in or near there, all within Hingham Parish, Norfolkshire, with one dying in infancy before her death in 1630. Three days short of four months after Frances's death, John married (2nd) Nazareth (HOBART) TURNER 13d 7m 1630 at Hingham, Norfolkshire, England. They had three children born in Hingham Parish, Norfolkshire before they emmigrated to Massachusetts in 1638. They settled in the town of England where they had two more children for a total of five. Nazareth died in 1658 when John was age 70 and he married (3rd) Mary (GILMAN) JACOB, the widow of Nicholas JACOB on 10d 3m 1658/59 in Hignham. Both of them were fellow Hingham Parish, Norfolkshire emmigrants. John & Mary each had children form their combined three previous marriages but had none together.

John Sr. BEAL lived for 50 years in Hingham Parish, Norfolkshire, England and 50 years in Hingham, Massachusetts. Of his eleven children, John died in infancy; Rebecca never married; Joshua had one daughter who was his only surviving child; Martha, Sarah, Caleb, and Jacob had small families that produced a small number of descendants; and Mary, Jeremiah, the second son named John, and Nathaniel had large families that bore a number of descendants esepcially in families of Mary and Jeremiah.

It wasn't until he had reached the age of 50 that he took up the challenge of leaving his homeland and became a pioneer in a strange new country. He came from Hingham, Norfolk Co. and arrived at Boston on the vessel "Diligent" on August 10, 1638. He brought with him his wife, Nazareth, five sons, three daughters and two servants. (One of the servants may have been his brother Edmond's son also named John). They settled in Hingham which is a few miles southeast of Boston. John was no doubt well aware of the new settlement. Ralph Smith had come from Hingham, Eng. in 1633 and founded Hingham, Mass. Additionally his wife's brother, Rev. Peter Hobart, was already settled there and was the first minister of the town.

Not long after arrival John Beal became a landholder obtaining a grant of six acres for a house lot on what is now the south side of South Street west of Hersey Street. She is my 11th Great-Grandmother by her first marriage to Nicholas JACOB with whom she emigrated to Massachusetts. The date of death you have is where she married second to John Sr. BEAL (bp. 1593 died 1688) as his third wife.

Mary's father IS definitely Edward Gilman, Sr. He was born in about 1587 in Norfolk, England. The names of his parents are conflicting. I am leaving the names of the parents blank until I find proof. Anyway, on June 3, 1614, Edward married Mary Clark in Hingham, Norfolk, England. They had at least seven children, one did not survive the infancy. Their oldest child, Mary Gilman, was born in 1615. She married Nicholas Jacob (I am not able to find their English marriage record). In 1633, they left for Massachusetts. On April 26, 1638, Edward, wife Mary, and their five children (Edward, Jr., Moses, Lydia, Sarah, and John) got on the Dilligent ship, leaving from Gravesend, Kent, England, and arrived Boston, Massachusetts, on August 10, 1638. 

Non-Cemetery Burial, Specifically: John BEAL does NOT have a marked grave at the Hingham Cemetery. It is possible that he was buried there but he does not show up on the current survey of that cemetery.

John Sr. BEAL, the emmigrant ancestor of the majority of BEAL descendants in America and Canada was said to be age 100 when he died in 1688. Thus his birth in Wymondham, Norfolkshire, England would have occurred about 1588. However, the first documented record of him appears on 8d 5m 1593 when he was baptised in the neighboring town of Wramplingham.

John Sr. "the centurian" BEAL was married twice. He married (1st) the widow Frances (RIPLEY) TAYLOR

Three days short of four months after Frances's death, John married (2nd) Nazareth (HOBART) TURNER 13d 7m 1630 at Hingham, Norfolkshire, England. They had three children born in Hingham Parish, Norfolkshire before they emmigrated to Massachusetts in 1638. They settled in the town of England where they had two more children for a total of five. Nazareth died in 1658 when John was age 70 and he married (3rd) Mary (GILMAN) JACOB, the widow of Nicholas JACOB on 10d 3m 1658/59 in Hignham. Both of them were fellow Hingham Parish, Norfolkshire emmigrants. John & Mary each had children form their combined three previous marriages but had none together.

John Sr. BEAL lived for 50 years in Hingham Parish, Norfolkshire, England and 50 years in Hingham, Massachusetts. Of his eleven children, John died in infancy; Rebecca never married; Joshua had one daughter who was his only surviving child; Martha, Sarah, Caleb, and Jacob had small families that produced a small number of descendants; and Mary, Jeremiah, the second son named John, and Nathaniel had large families that bore a number of descendants esepcially in families of Mary and Jeremiah.

http://beals-genealogy.com/the-book/index.html JOHN BEALES, the tenth child of Edward Beales, was the one who brought the name (which he spelled "Beal") to North America. It wasn't until he had reached the age of 50 that he took up the challenge of leaving his homeland and became a pioneer in a strange new country. He came from Hingham, Norfolk Co. and arrived at Boston on the vessel "Diligent" on August 10, 1638. He brought with him his wife, Nazareth, five sons, three daughters and two servants. (One of the servants may have been his brother Edmond's son also named John). They settled in Hingham which is a few miles southeast of Boston. John was no doubt well aware of the new settlement. Ralph Smith had come from Hingham, Eng. in 1633 and founded Hingham, Mass. Additionally his wife's brother, Rev. Peter Hobart, was already settled there and was the first minister of the town.

Not long after arrival John Beal became a landholder obtaining a grant of six acres for a house lot on what is now the south side of South Street west of Hersey Street. On the 13th of March, 1639, he was admitted to the freedom of Massachusetts Colony and thus became a "freeman". He was deputy to the general court in 1640 and 1659. He was a shoemaker, a trade that seems to have been passed down to succeeding generations. John Beal died at the age of 100. Family details follow:

Hingham Bell Tower

Description Hingham Memorial Bell Tower In Hingham, Mass. is located the Old Church Meeting House. Right next to it is a Bell Tower made of brick. A sign by it says "Hingham Memorial Bell Tower Dedicated 1912 To The Settlers of Hingham". A woman by the name of Miss Susan Willard and Louis Cornish held a drive to erect the Bell Tower as a monument to the first settlers of Hingham. This was to be erected beside the Old Meeting House. The Tower was dedicated in 1912 with much pomp and circumstance. The lovely bells sending competing sounds among the sounds of auto horns. It holds one of only twenty sets of change-ringing bells in North America. (My note, Change-Ringing Bells do not produce recognizable tunes, but rung in and orderly sequence in rows. Go to this web site and hear what change ringing bells sound like, http://stpaulsparish.org/change ringing.html . The old flint block from the market place in Hingham, England was to be the cornerstone of the Tower but due to it's irregular shape was placed inside the Tower. This stone was the stepping stone that stood in the Public Square in Hingham England. In 1928 vandals broke the windows in the Tower. On August 14, 1945 the bells were rung to announce Japan's surrender. In The Sept 1908 Bulletin the Former Governor John L. Bates spoke of the part that men of these types of our Bates Ancestors had in liberating the thought of the world and he called attention to the Memorial Tower and Chime of bells to be erected. In the Bates Bulletin April 1909 it first talks about the Tower to be erected at a cost of \$10,000. The hopes were to dedicate it at the town's 275th anniversary 1910, (My Note:

Apparently this did not happen as it was not dedicated till 1912).

The Bulletin stated that <u>Clement Bates</u> descendants should be very interested in this as he was one of the early settlers. In the Sept 1909 Bulletin The Association urged it's members to aid in erecting the Memorial to the First Settlers of Hingham. Sandy Bates and her Mother-in-law Esther Bates took a trip to Hingham, going to the Church and the Bell Tower. And of course Clements Dedication stone is there that The Bates Association placed. Harold and Sandy's Double Line of Bates is Clement.








Figure 79: Francis Griswold (Cemetery Unknonw) (August 02, 1652)










Figure 83: Hannah Griswold U.S., New England Marriages Prior to 1700 (1762) Genealogical Publishing Co.; Baltimore, MD, USA; Volume Title: New England Marriages Prior to 1700
