PREFACE

A few words about the research are needed.

First, it is important that I try to support the data with documents or media that support the data of each individual. This helps to validate and provide confirmation of the genealogy history recorded about a person and their families. In some cases I have seen many forms of data, but I only attached those that provide proof to help support my recordings. If I attached all I could find would provide too much for my computer files and overload the presentation.

In United States history are numerous varieties of record types that have been preserved. Each of these records provide the trail of the people and their documented history. There are many sources that provide information of this documented history. In this book are footnotes of the source documents or places this research has been recorded. There are so many types of sources to mention here, but this book provides some of that information as recorded in my Family Tree Maker (FTM) file.

Some of the data has been found or learned but have no supporting documentation. Why? Because to maintain limited electronic files; and that some of the information has been discovered on many sources. In some cases, it is real information known by people of these families.

Ireland is divided by two territories. Northern Ireland, and The Republic of Ireland (the Irish Free State). Northern Ireland is under the control of British rule. The Republic of Ireland is its own sovereignty nation. The name "Éire" is the nickname or name used for Ireland.

First, one has to understand the land divisions of countries. This helps understanding to find people and where they lived.

One important note about individual and family names. Each surname coupled with given names you will find many of the same name or combination of names. Therefore, other items such as parents, birth, death, marriage, territory, and possible other items are required to ensure one has identified the current person and family.

Enjoy reading, but there is so much to learn. This document will provide a base for anyone wishing to do genealogy research or just adding to this family information.

RESEARCH NOTES

Doing genealogy research is a long term and time-consuming task. If one is doing it for real, they will collect a great amount of data about life of people, the territory they lived, and learn about the uniting of families. For this researcher, there is much learned that is way above what is taught about history in school classes. Research can include working with on-line resources in today's Internet and can include travel to obtain information and documentation from Federal, State, County, City, or towns from records they kept. Cemetery records are a great source found on-line via the Internet.

There are many avenues why folks do genealogy research. For this researcher, I am not writing a book, I am trying to learn of past family and a small bit about them. I am not recording every detail that is possible. If I did, I would not be able to share what I have discovered in this book and I would still be on the road to discovery.

What is in this book is free to all to read, print, or share as they desire. This information is public and can be found by others; therefore, I am not doing this for any monies or profit, just for the pleasure of doing this research and a great retirement hobby for me.

This research has been ongoing between 2000 to 2021 to compile and record in this book. There are many resources, these are just some of them.

The following is a sampling about what I used to do research.

1. Ancestry.com [<https://www.ancestry.com/>] web site. (Pay to use)
2. "Family Search" [<https://www.familysearch.org/en/>] (Free to the public] web site that is open to anyone. This site is created and supported by The Church of Latter-Day Saints in Salt Lake City, Utah (aka Mormon Church or LDS).
3. Using an Internet browser to search by varies names or phrases does help locate some information.
4. Primary source documents such as: US Census, Birth, Death certificates, cemetery records, civil documents, and immigration records or other documents that support the validation of family names and their link to relatives.
5. Find-a-Grave: [<https://www.findagrave.com/>]. In the attached files you may see the term "**Memorial ID**" with a number sequence. By going to the Find a Grave web site and entering this Memorial ID, that will take you to the grave information that has been recorded by folks who go to cemeteries and document the graves. In some cases, you will see the grave maker and other information folks have recorded for that person. In some cases, there are links to parents, siblings, and children along with spouses that all have a Memorial ID recorded.
6. Historical Societies and Internet Genealogy resources

NOTES:

1) ANCESTOR: Also known as a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.

2) DESCENDANT: Are descending after a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.

- **Meaning of "direct descendant" as opposed to "indirect descendant"**

1. A direct descendant is someone who can trace their lineage by "child" relationships all the way back to the desired ancestor.

2. A non-direct descendant has to go through a "cousin" or "by marriage" or some other non-child relationship in order to find the desired ancestor.

Definition of genealogy.

1. An account of the descent of a person, family, or group from an ancestor or from older forms.
2. Regular descent of a person, family, or group of organisms from a progenitor or older form: pedigree. The study of family ancestral lines.

Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of 18 June 2022.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children.

Any files/Media collected is attached to a person or family is pictured with each family.

The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number. Each spouse and their children is a "Nuclear Family".

For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family.

Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Families of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Jane Kinsey are presented in a form of an enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose ancestors are listed in the later chapters.

The chapter titled "<HeadlineFamilies>" provides details (as known as of this publication date) for the ancestors of Jane Kinsey.

There is a chapter for each generation.

Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 62 individuals, of whom 35 are male and 27 are female. Of the 48 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 56 years. Of these, 26 males averaged 51.8 years, and 22 females averaged 61 years. The longest living male was Rev Fr Charles Henry Wharton (1748–1833), who died aged 85. The longest living female was Sarah Ogden (ca.1691–1787), who died aged 96.

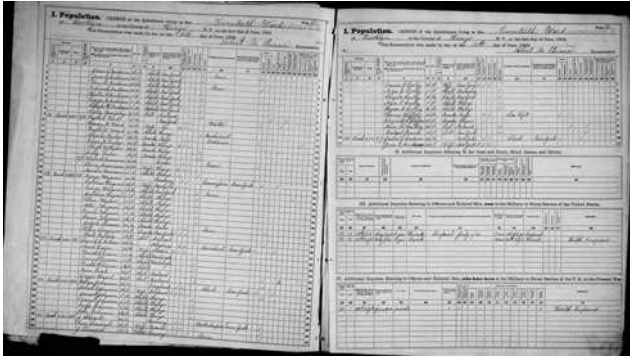


Figure 7: New York, State Census, 1865

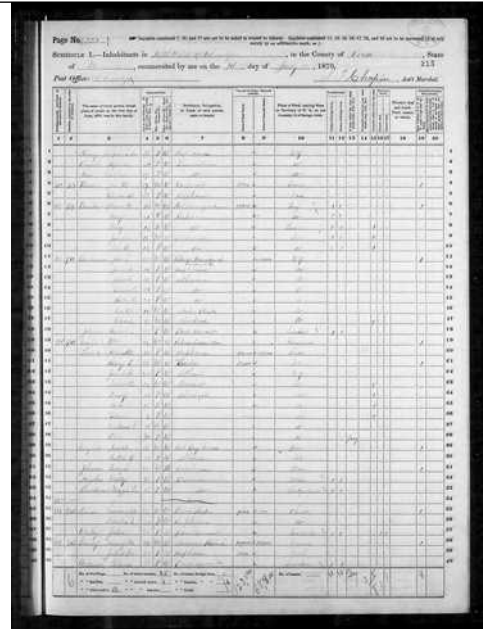
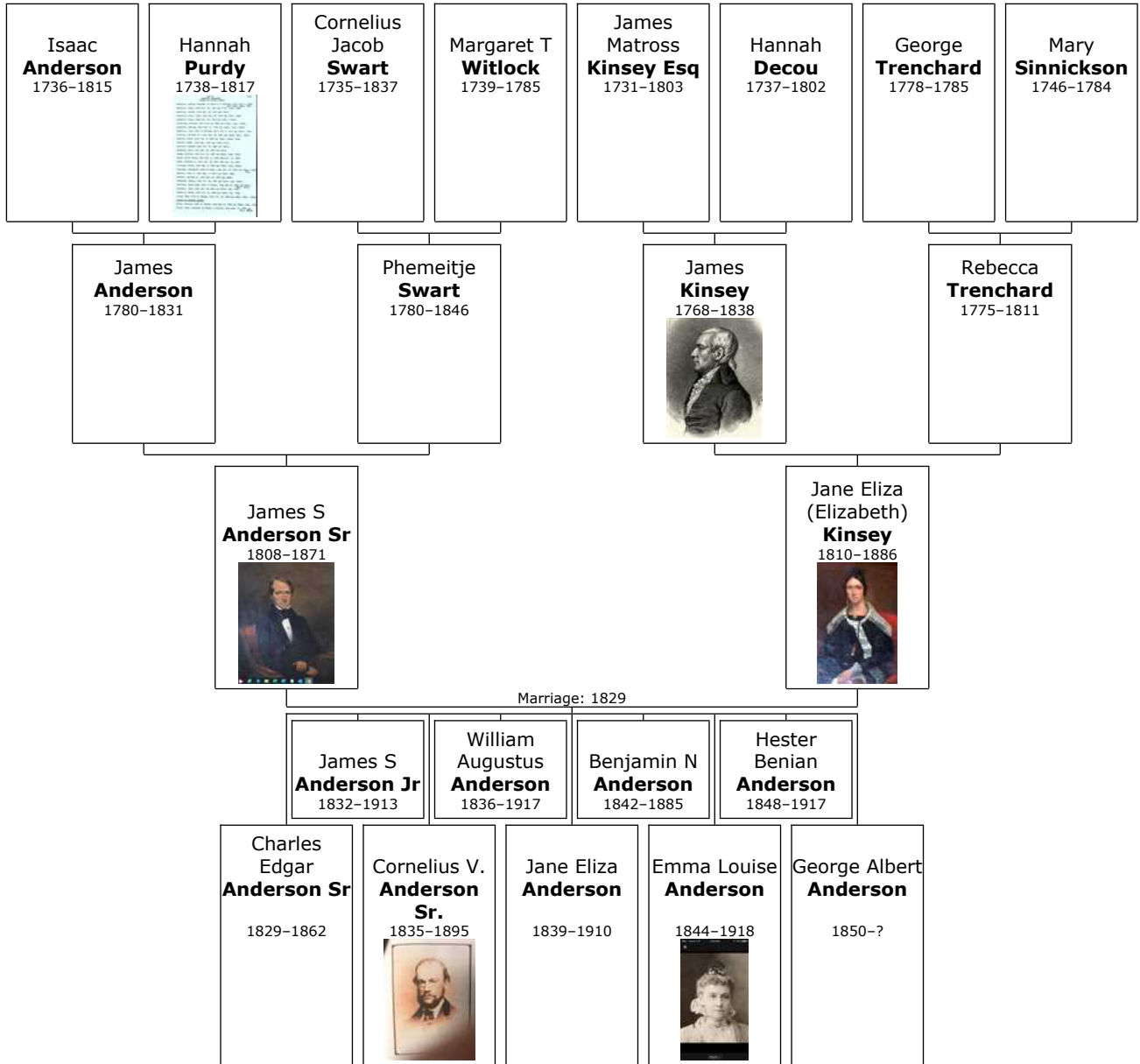


Figure 8: Anderson Family 1870 United States Federal Census

At the age of 18, Jane Eliza (Elizabeth) Kinsey married **James S Anderson Sr** on Saturday, 07 February 1829, in New York, New York, when he was 20 years old.^[7, 8] They had nine children: Charles, James, Cornelius, William, Jane, Benjamin, Emma, Hester and George.



James S Anderson Sr

James S was born in Manhattan on Tuesday, 12 April 1808.^[1, 5, 6, 8, 9] He was the son of James Anderson and Phemeitje Swart.

He was baptized in New York on 30 July 1808.^[8] James S reached 63 years of age and died in Chicago City, Cook, Illinois, on 11 August 1871.^[10] He was buried in Brooklyn, Kings, New York, USA.^[10]

The family left New York/New Jersey and came to Chicago in 1867 and was engaged in the hotel and restaurant business. He was the proprietor of the Continental Hotel at the time of the Chicago Fire in 1881.

In 1881 he is found in Davenport, Iowa via U.S. city Directory listed as a Steward. That was a job on a train at that time.

Having been wiped out by the Chicago fire, The family is found in 1885 living in Iowa City, Iowa, and Cornelius is listed as a Hotel Keeper for the "Clinton Hotel". Based on records found, the family then moved to Davenport, Iowa about 1885 where he was a participant in building the Brevort House. He was a steward on the dining car of the Rock Island Railroad from Chicago to Iowa City. Also worked in Des Moines."

Note: Newspaper article states fire was started 10/8/1871.

"Continental Hotel" was a major event in that era. There are many accounts published of this event. The Continental building did have some rebuilding and owned by others. There is information about the "Inter-National Continental Hotel" that was refurbished after 1970s that indicates this was the site of the original "Continental Hotel" in Chicago. One of those articles follows.

DOWNTOWN HOTEL TO BE REHABBED

Redevelopment of the long-shuttered Hotel Continental on North Michigan Avenue will finally begin this fall with a unit of Chrysler Corp. as the majority owner, it was learned Friday.

The hotel will be split into two hotels, according to Continental's present owner. The North Tower will reopen as a Forum Hotel in late 1988 or early 1989 and the South Tower will open as the Hotel Inter-Continental Chicago in the summer of 1989.

Details of the \$124 million deal, which is expected to be closed in September, were disclosed Friday by Lester Mehlman, president of MAT Associates Inc., Chicago, the present owner of the hotel at 505 N. Michigan Ave., and John Cashman, vice president of Inter-Continental Hotels Corp., New York.

The two hotels are expected to employ nearly 900, or slightly more than the old Hotel Continental employed before it closed last Nov. 14. They will contain a total of 863 rooms, down from 905 in the old hotel.

The Forum division of Inter-Continental will operate the first Forum Hotel in the U.S., with 517 guest rooms and services and room rates competitive with the downtown Marriott and Hyatt Regency hotels, Cashman said. The Inter-Continental will be a 346-room property with the amenities and prices of the Ritz-Carlton Hotel, he said.

"The Forum will be for the budget-conscious business traveler and the McCormick Place trade show visitor,"

Cashman explained, "while the Inter-Continental will serve the person who's very high up in his company, as well as people attending very high-level corporate business meetings."

The property, originally just the 45-story South Tower, opened in 1929 as the Medinah Athletic Club. Sheraton Corp. acquired it in 1960 and built the 26-story North Tower.

MAT Associates purchased the hotel from Sheraton in 1978, retained Radisson Hotel Corp. to operate it, and renamed the building the Radisson Chicago Hotel.

The owner terminated Radisson's contract in 1982, renamed it the Hotel Continental, operated it until last November and shut it down for a renovation that was to have started in December.

However, the project stalled after its principal lender, the New York State Employees Retirement System, demanded that MAT and Inter-Continental line up a second lender to share the risk of financing the development, Mehlman said.

That lender will be Chrysler Insurance Co., which has agreed to put up half of the cash for the project's mortgage. Another unit of the automaker, Chrysler Capital Corp., will buy a 51 percent stake in the property.

MAT and Inter-Continental will be minority shareholders, along with Melvin Simon & Associates Inc., an Indianapolis shopping center developer.

Plans were drawn by Chicago architect Harry Weese call for building a glass-and-brass cupola above the South Tower entrance, 501 N. Michigan, to set it off from the rest of the property.

Crystal chandeliers, bronze staircases, marble floors, polished granite walls, gold-leaf trim, and wall and ceiling murals will be restored in the 50,000 square feet of public areas. These will include a 600-seat ballroom, one of three in the building.

A French restaurant seating about 100 people will be on the second floor overlooking a new main lobby and registration area.

MAT also plans to build a modern health club around the existing Olympic- sized swimming pool on the 16th floor. The pool is about all that`s left of the athletic club`s original recreational facilities, which included a shooting range, bowling alley and billiards room.

As for the guest rooms, Cashman said, "we`ll take them down to their steel and concrete and rebuild them with all the frills and bells and whistles that go with a five-star hotel."

Guests will enter the Forum Hotel through the glass atrium that served the old Hotel Continental. Its registration lobby will be on the first floor rather than the second. Existing guest rooms in the North Tower will be retained and renovated.

The Forum will have roughly 12,000 square feet of public areas, including a 600-seat ballroom on the first floor and two restaurants on the first and second floors.

The construction financing will come from a consortium headed by the Bank of New York, with Fuji Bank Ltd. of Japan and Dresden Bank of West Germany among the secondary lenders.

This is MAT`s second hotel project underway downtown after the Swiss Grand, a \$125 million joint venture of MAT, Swiss Air Transport Co. Ltd

(Swissair), Nestle S.A. and E.F. Hutton Inc. That hotel, with 42 floors and 647 rooms, is scheduled to open next summer on the south side of Wacker Drive east of Columbus Drive in Illinois Center.

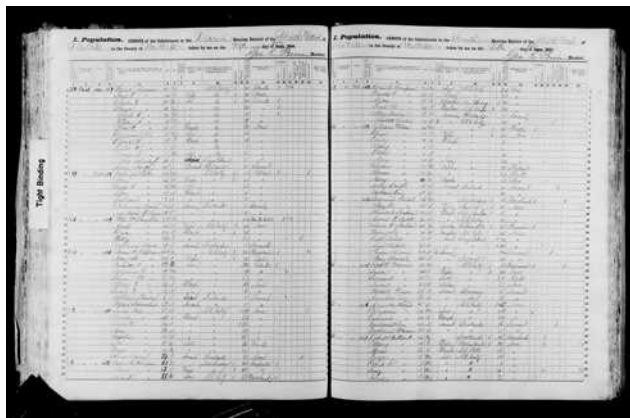


Figure 11: Anderson James New York, State Census, 1855

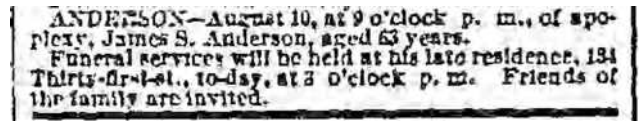

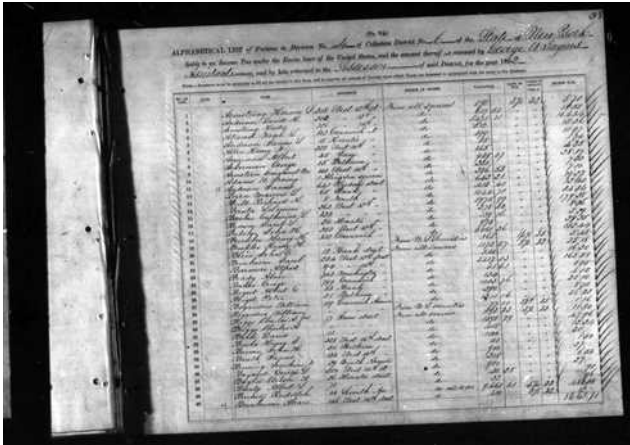


Figure 21: U.S. IRS Tax Assessment Lists, 1862-1918

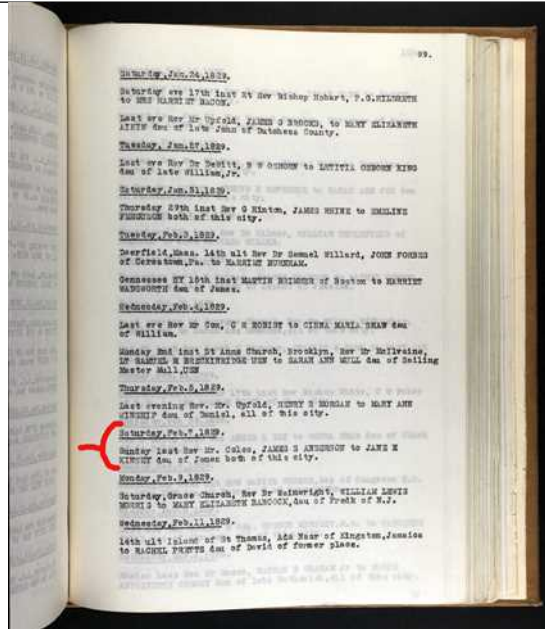
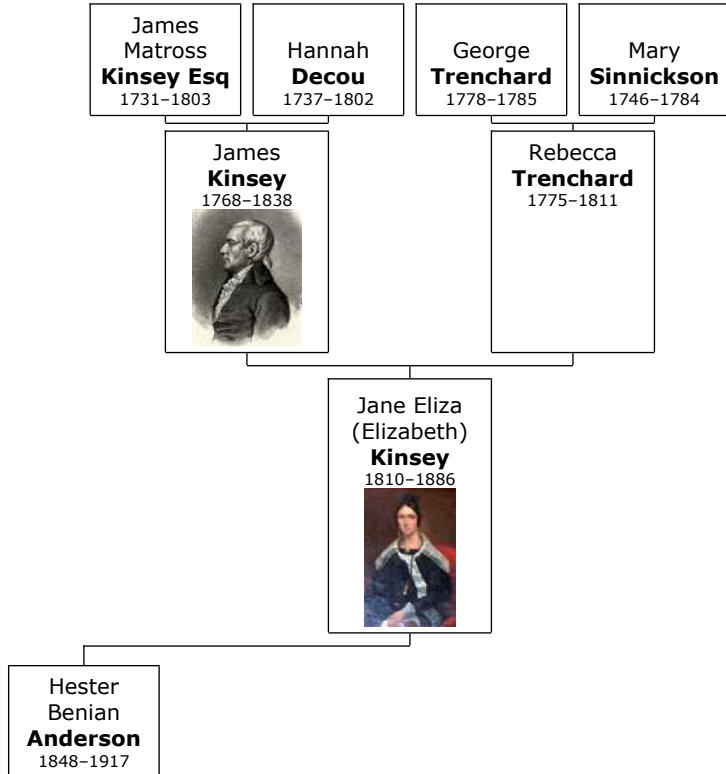


Figure 22: U.S., Newspaper Extractions from the Northeast, 1704-1930 (1829)

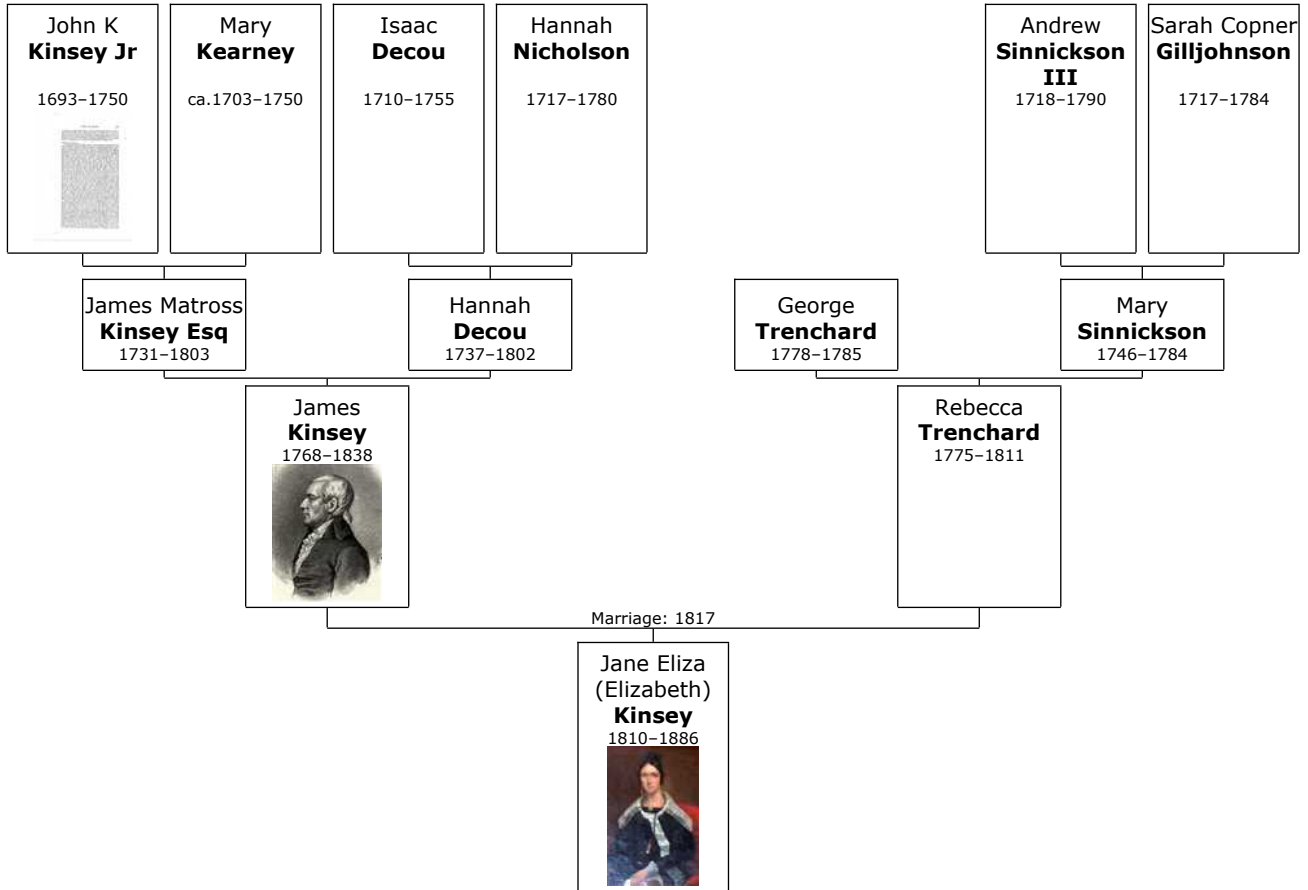

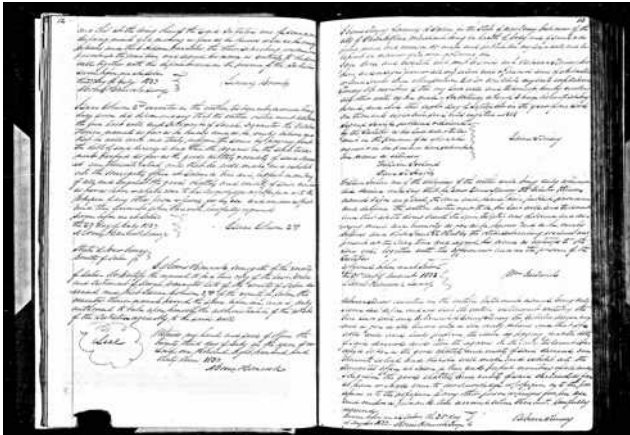


Figure 25: Kinsey James Will

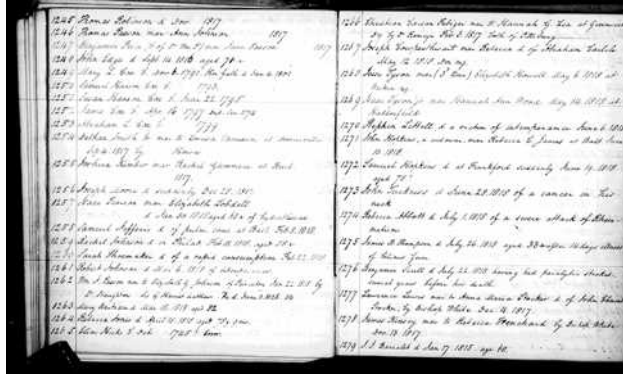
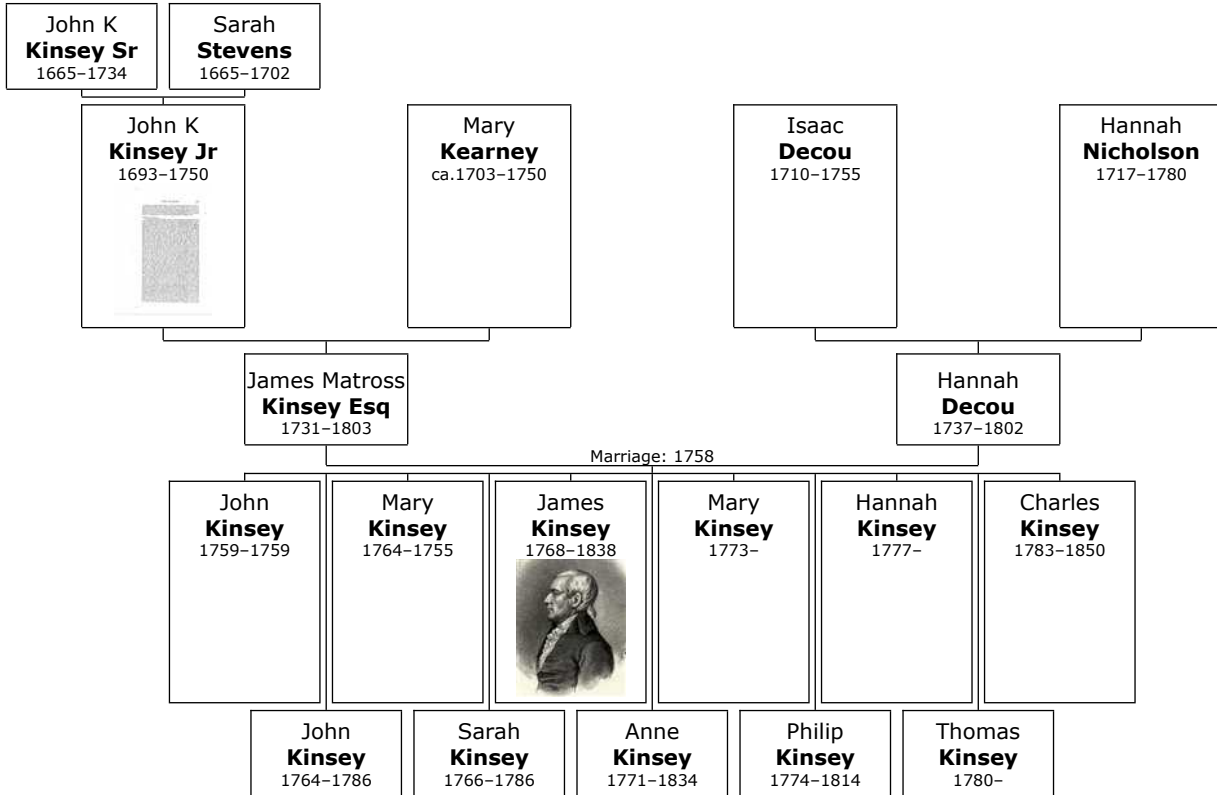


Figure 27: Pennsylvania and New Jersey, Church and Town Records, 1669-2013

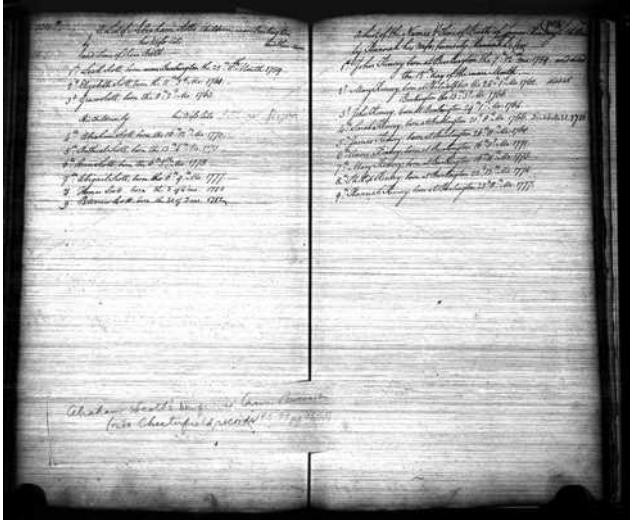


Figure 28: Kinsey James M U.S., Quaker Meeting Records, 1681-1935(3)(1) (1/5/2021 5:22:16 PM)

He presided at the trial of Bruno Hauptmann at Flemington in 1935 for the murder of the Lindbergh baby. He was 78. Justice Trenchard had been in poor health five years. His death occurred at 4:10 A.M. at his home, 216 Riverside Avenue. WORLD FAMOUS. The trial of Hauptmann played the same of Justice Trenchard before the world, but nothing in his manner before, during or after the trial suggested he regarded it differently than the many others at which he had presided in his long career on the bench. Trenchard. His father was for many years county clerk of Cumberland County and a widely known surgeon. The jurist received his early education in Bridgeton schools and was graduated from South Jersey Institute in 1862. Justice Trenchard studied law in the office of Porter & Nixson, Bridgeton, was admitted to the bar in 1864 and became a counselor in 1889. He was city solicitor for Bridgeton from 1892 to 1899. Serving as Assemblyman from Cumberland County in 1889 when he was 24, Justice Trenchard was the youngest member of the House. He was a Presidential elector in 1894 and cast his ballot for McKinley and Hobart. He was Common Pleas Judge of Cumberland for two terms, and on June 3, 1904, Governor Sikes named him an associate justice of the Supreme Court to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Justice Dixon. He was appointed for a full term of seven years in 1907. Justice Trenchard moved from Bridgeton to Trenton in 1911

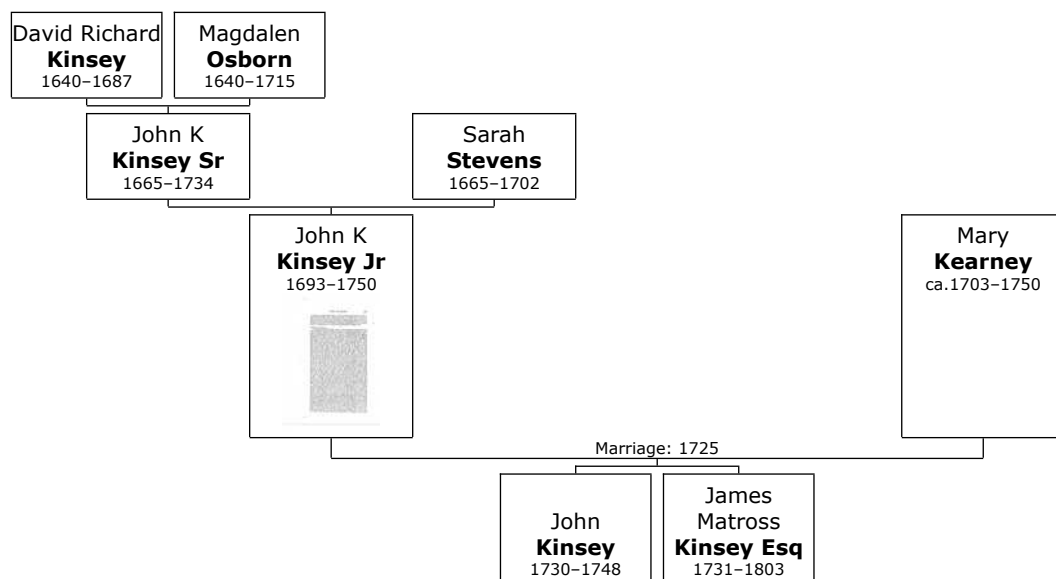

KINSEY, John, jurist, was born in Philadelphia, Pa., in 1693; son of a Quaker preacher, and grandson of John Kinsey, who came to America from London in 1677, as a commissioner of the proprietors of West Jersey. He practised law in New Jersey until 1730, meanwhile serving as a member of the assembly and as speaker of that body. He removed to Philadelphia in 1730, and in that year became a member of the Pennsylvania assembly, to which body he was re-elected successively until 1750, being speaker, 1739-50. He was attorney-general of the province, 1738-41, and chief-justice of the same, 1743-50. In 1737 he was one of the two commissioners sent to Maryland to negotiate for a settlement of the boundary dispute, and was a commissioner from Pennsylvania to negotiate a

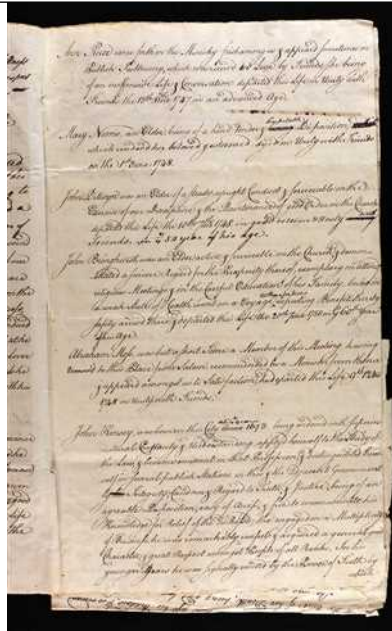
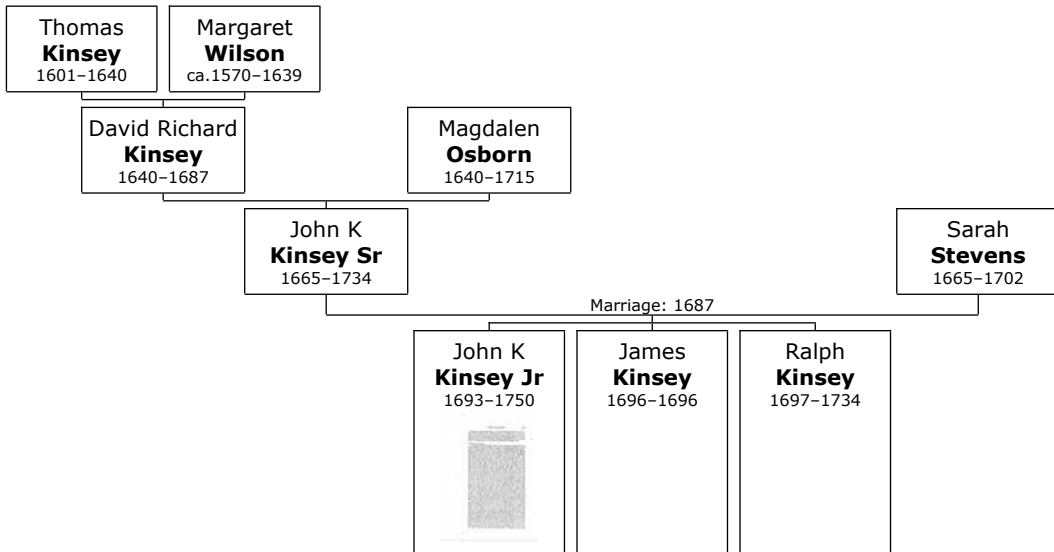


Figure 39: Kinsey John U.S., Quaker Meeting Records, 1681-1935 (1693)

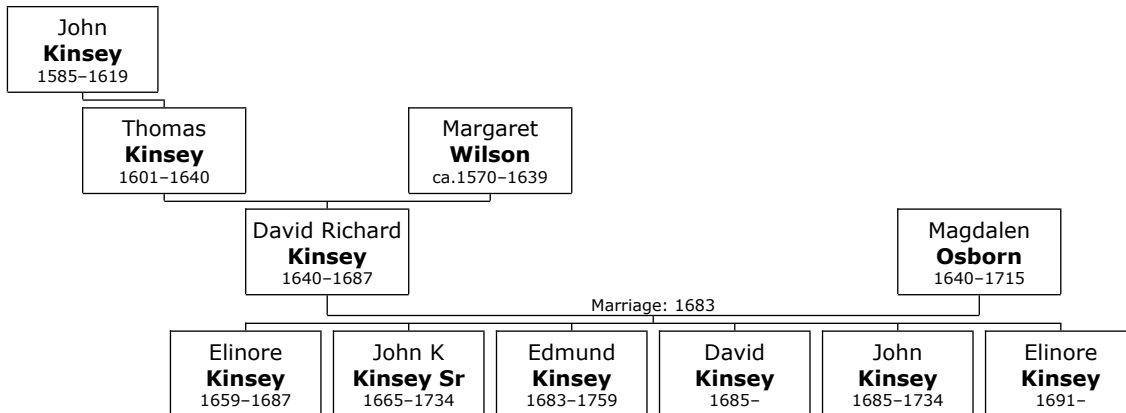

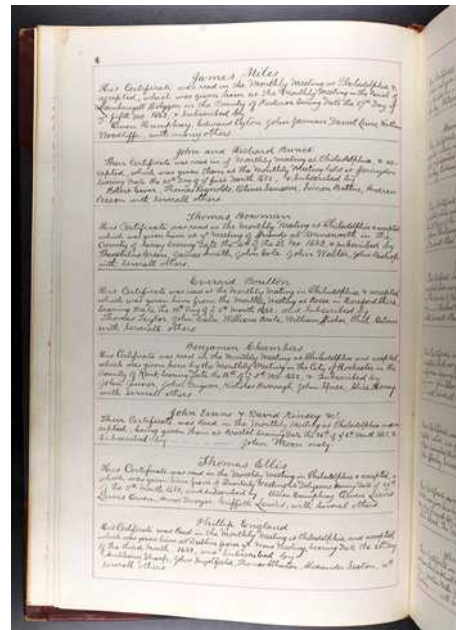
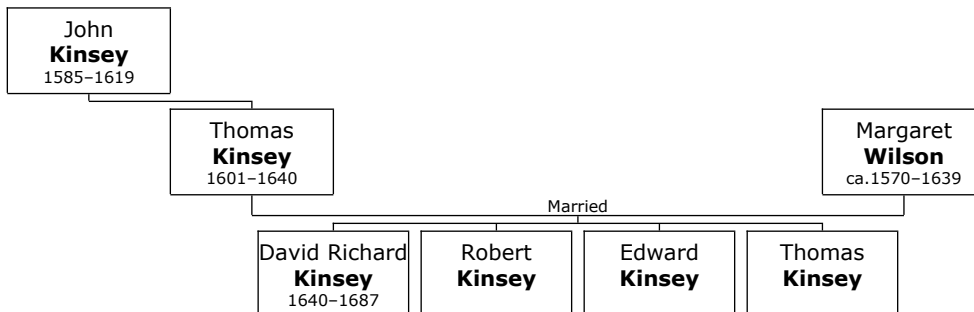


Figure 41: U.S., Quaker Meeting Records, 1681-1935 Haverford College; Haverford, Pennsylvania; Removals, 1681-1758; Collection: Philadelphia Yearly Meeting Minutes
