# **PREFACE**

Countries may have been divided by different areas. It may be neccesary to learn about a countries administrative divisions.

One other note about individual and family names. Each surname coupled with given names, there are many of the same name or combination of names. Therefore, other items such as birth, death, marriage, territory, and possible other items are required to ensure one has identified the current person or family.

It's important that you ensure that you valid a finding. Just because a name make look correct, it takes documented validation of at least 3 or more documents to prove that you found the correct individual or family.

Enjoy reading, but there is so much to learn. This document will provide a base for anyone wishing to do genealogy research or just adding to this family information.

#### **RESEARCH NOTES**

Doing genealogy research is a long term and time-consuming task. If one is doing it for real, they will collect a great amount of data about their lives, about the territory they lived, and learn about the integration of families. For this researcher, there is much learned that is way above what is taught about history in school classes. Research can include working with on-line resources and can include travel to obtain information and documentation from Federal, State, County, City, or towns from records they keep. Cemetery records are a great source found on-line via the Internet.

There are many avenues why folks do genealogy research. For this researcher, I am not writing a book, I am trying to learn of past family and a small bit about them. I am not recording every detail that is possible. If I did, I would not be able to share what I have discovered in this book and I would still be on the road to discovery.

What is in this book is free to all to read, print, or share as they desire. This information is public and can be found by others; therefore, I am not doing this for any monies or profit, just for the pleasure of doing this research and a great retirement hobby for me.

This research has been ongoing since 2000 to compile and record in the attached book. There are many resources, these are just some of them.

In some cases, you will see the grave maker and other information folks have recorded for that person. In some cases, there are links to parents, siblings, and children along with spouses that all a Memorial ID recorded.

#### NOTES:

- 1) ANCESTOR: Also known as a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.
- 2) DESCENDANT: Are descending after a forefather, fore-elder or a forebear.
  - Meaning of "direct descendant" as opposed to "indirect descendant"
  - 1. A direct descendant is someone who can trace their lineage by "child" relationships all the way back to the desired ancestor.
  - 2. A non-direct descendant has to go through a "cousin" or "by marriage" or some other non-child relationship in order to find the desired ancestor.

## Definition of genealogy.

- 1. An account of the descent of a person, family, or group from an ancestor or from older forms.
- 2. Regular descent of a person, family, or group of organisms from a progenitor or older form: pedigree. The study of family ancestral lines.

#### Introduction

The following pages list data for all known family members as of August 07, 2021.

Each immediate family is presented in their own section that contains a graphical family tree as well as a description with information about each referenced person and their children.

The child section provides information about the children of the preceding couple. When a child has offspring of their own this is presented in a separate family section for that child. In this case a '+' is used to denote that an individual will appear later in the book as a parent with his/her own children and there is a link to the appropriate family reference number.

For children with partners but no offspring the partner data is given with the reference family.

Roman numerals, followed by a period, are used to indicate the birth order.

In the chapter titled "Families of the Starting Person" the ancestors of Walter Bamber are presented in a kind of enhanced Pedigree Chart which displays the graphic representation of their direct-line ancestors and the children of the couple. This chapter contains information about the couple whose ancestors are listed in the later chapters.

The chapter titled "<HeadlineFamilies>" provides details (as known as of this publication date) for the ancestors of Walter Bamber.

There is a chapter for each generation.

Relatives are listed in the order of the nearness of their relationship.

Sources for the information provided are given in the footnotes.

This document reports the details of 128 individuals, of whom 71 are male and 57 are female. Of the 52 individuals with recorded birth and death dates, the average lifespan was 62.7 years. Of these, 30 males averaged 60.1 years, and 22 females averaged 66.4 years. The longest living male was James Archibald Crosby (1835–1927), who died aged 91. The longest living female was Sarah Jane Crain (1834–1932), who died aged 97.








Figure 3: 1930 United States Federal Census Year: 1930; Census Place: Santa Clara, Santa Clara, California; Page: 3A; Enumeration District: 0103







Thomas Parker immigrated from Whittingham, Lancashire, England. To the best of my knowledge, his parents, Geroge Parker and Agnes Swarsbreck (also Spelled Swarbrick) had twelve children, with Thomas being the eighth. Like most of his siblings he was baptized at St. Francis Hill Chapel, Goosnargh, Lancashire. Goosnargh and Whittingham are two very small villages lying adjacent to one another. Thomas was baptized November 7, 1817.

Thomas' brother Richard, the next younger sibling, was baptized July 8, 1819. Thomas and Richard may be the only siblings to have immigrated to the United States, but I am not certain. Richard is mentioned in Prairie du Long records for a period of time, and was a member of the St. Augustine of Canterbury Church. Eventually he married Mary Wilkinson, Ellen's niece by her sister Ann Bamber and George Wilkinson. They later moved to Macon, Illinois where they remained the rest of their lives and today rest eternally at the Macon Cemetery.

Thomas did not leave an obvious trial, and some information about him continues to elude me. I am not sure about hi arrival date to this county nor to Illinois. He and Ellen purchased land in St. Clair County near the Monroe County boarder. During 1856 they made their residence at newly acquired property. Today the home is in disrepair but it

remains standing on a hill at the end of a long private lane located 1/2 mile north of Hecker, Illinois on the east side of State Route 159. His new residence was short-lived as he died on may 22, 1857. Thomas is buried at St. Augustine Cemetery located on Cemetery Road off State Route 156 west of Hecker.

Ellen Bamber was born the daughter of James Bamber and Mary Threlfall on November 28, 1827. Both of her parents were Lancashire immigrants who arrived at Prairie Du Long with their own parents and siblings some 6-8 years prior. When her husband Thomas died, Ellen was left widowed at the age of 29 with five children, ages 1-1/2 to 9 years. See the front page story, second column. On February 22, 1859, Ellen married Geroge Hist, an English farmer located on property adjoining the Parker farm. Three Children are know to have been born to this union. Elizabeth was born the year following their marriage. Albert was born 11 July 1863 and Sarah Ellen Hirst was born 2 April 1867. Albert married Agnes Thompson in 1886. Elizabeth appears to have died as an infant. Ellen died on 1 December 1887 and is buried at St. Agustine Cemetery between her two husbands.

Ellen Bamber married **George Hirst** on Tuesday, February 22, 1859, in Prairie du Long, Monroe County, IL. They had three children: Elizaberth, Albert and Sarah.

At that time the "Pacific Coast Business Directory" of 1872 lists the American House at Centerville operated by Joesph. It was one of the principal hostelries of Alameda County. The couple also operated a laundry in Alameda for a time, then the famous old Newport baths near Nepturn Beach near Alameda.

In 1893, the couple moved to the Los Gatos area,

moving to a mountain area west of Los Gatos settling in an area today known as Holy City. In 1895, the family moved to Skyland where they operated a small hotel, a ranch or two, and finally the newspaper which was Bamber's last enterprise. Joesph Bamber began a newpaper service that mainly reported real estate and small mountian news. The newpaper was called the "The Mountain" Reality" that was circulated in the "Skyland" community; and it was published by the Santa Cruz Sentinel later it was published in Los Gatos. It was published for two decades then in 1922 it was absorbed by the "Los Gatos Mail-News". Amoung other businesses associated with Joesph Bamber is a pony service running from Oakland to Centerville. An original cover in the philatelic collection of E.E. Place of Los Gatos bears the heading "Bamber & McLeod Express". Bamber amassed a considerable fortune in the business; but lost it later.

Joesph John Bamber was knocked down by a car near the county alms house where he spent his last days. The briefest of notices in the newspaper about his death was listed as an "unidentified itinernant". He was later identified. Joesph died in the County Hospital from a fractured skull.
